The meeting being called to order by the Secretary, upon motion, Mr. Charles Rogers was made Chairman.

The minutes of the third annual meeting were read and adopted. The Secretary read the Fourth Annual Report of the Board of Trustees, and, there being no objection, it stood approved. Upon motion, the meeting proceeded to the election of five Trustees to serve for three years.

FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Board of Trustees

TO THE

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.

Read at the Annual Meeting of the Members, Tuesday, the 26th of October, A.D. 1875, in the Board of Trade Room, Mercantile Library, Philadelphia.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION :

The Board of Trustees respectfully submit the following report :—

The recurrence of the annual meeting is the period for reviewing the past work of the Association and counting the promises of the future. Your Board of Trustees congratulate the members, at this season, upon the prosperous condition of the Association. The advent of the Centennial year, and the fifth year of our existence as a corporation, finds the Association with a creditable surplus in their treasury and a prosperous and respectable membership, and a prominence in the field of Art Education that commends the Association still more strongly to the people of this city and calls upon all for co-operation. The financial exhibit of the Treasurer, Mr. James L. Claghorn, appended to

this report, lays before you the pecuniary resources of our Association. The perplexed and uncertain financial condition of the business world, which has tended to limit or suspend the generosity of those interested in the fields of art culture and scientific research, has not been felt any more severely by us than by kindred associations; no perceptible diminution in our collections has taken place since our last Annual Report; fully eighty per centum of the annual receipts are in hand, and the remainder of the year, it is hoped, will enable us to collect the outstanding indebtedness without the loss of any subscriptions.

At the date of our last annual meeting the number of

Since then we have lost, by resignation, seventeen, and by death, five; and nine Annual Contributors have become Life Members. We have received during the same time twenty-four new Annual Contributors, and your Board have unanimously elected to Honorary Membership, as a recognition of services generously rendered to the Association, the following gentlemen, viz.: Hon. Benj. Harris Brewster, Rev. Dr. A. A. Willits, Provost Chas. J. Stillé, and Mr. G. Henry Horstmann, Consul of the United States at Munich. Our present report therefore shows the following number of members:

which leaves the Association with a small accession to its ranks.

At the last annual reunion we extended a strong appeal to members to use their own individual effort and persuasion to

increase our list, believing that upon such solicitation, rather than upon the importunities of a paid agent, the Association could best rely for an increase to its ranks; whilst the response to this appeal has not been so general as your Board could wish, it has been listened to by some, and we find that all our new members have been secured in this way.

The Board again urge individual effort as the most effectual way to advance the project of our Association. The following members are credited with new subscribers :

Since the date of the last report the Association has not placed in the Park any new work. An unanimous resolution of your Board was passed at a special meeting in the spring,—“That it is not the policy of the Association to purchase or contract to purchase any more works of Art at present, in consideration of the fine collection from which to choose during the Centennial Exposition, and that the resources of the Association be husbanded until that time.”

A few complaints, deprecating this action, have reached the Board, made by persons impatient of the apparent slow development of our effort to adorn the Park; but these complaints have been satisfactorily answered, and we now believe all our members are in unison with the resolution adopted by the Board. With the fund already collected, it is true, many cheap and inartistic works could have been bought and located in the Park during this year, and to a few would have seemed like progress, but by

those who value Art for educational influence such expenditure would be condemned.

It is not the intention of the Association to destroy or modify the superb natural beauties of Fairmount Park by scattering within its inclosures illegitimate specimens of Art, now too frequently seen in this country, but rather to purchase at least one work of pronounced merit yearly until the growth and financial condition of our Association permit us to do more; to this end it is a source of congratulation to announce to you that our long-expected purchase, "The Dying Lioness," has reached this city and is now on exhibition, through the courtesy of Messrs. Earle & Sons, at their gallery on Chestnut Street. The work was shipped from Munich, under the direction of United States Consul G. Henry Horstmann, last June. Before departure it was exhibited at the request of the founder, Von Müller, for one week at the Art Union in Munich, being placarded as the property of our Association for presentation to Fairmount Park, and the following extract from a letter by Mr. Horstmann announcing the shipment shows to what effect: "I am happy to say that all the art authorities here speak of the group in the most commendatory terms, and it is a great satisfaction to me, as it will be to yourselves, to know that our city will be able to boast of a work of Art of the very highest merit. It is a noble group, and I have heard artists say that it is wonderful how so much poetry and sentiment can be thrown into such a subject."

As this admirable work is now before the public of Philadelphia, a short review of its history is not inappropriate.

The work was first brought to our notice by Mr. H. J. Swarzmänn, of this city; and through the active assistance of Mr. G. Henry Horstmann, United States Consul at Munich,—to whom the Association is deeply indebted in all its transactions in regard to this group,—the negotiations for a purchase of the work were completed. The artist is Prof. Wilhelm Wolf, of Berlin, and the model, exhibited at the Vienna International, was awarded the first prize among many competing subjects. When our Association first entered upon negotiations for the purchase, it was

brought to the notice of the Emperor of Germany, who preceded us in the purchase, but permission was generously granted by him for our Association to have the present replica, his own being intended for the Imperial Garden at Berlin.

The group was cast at the foundry of Ferdinand von Müller, Munich. The stipulated cost was 5000 thalers, but through the exertions of Mr. Horstmann, and in consequence of the delay in finishing the group, Mr. Müller deducted 100 thalers from the original price. The actual expenditure by the Association for the group was \$4424.72, currency, which includes a present insurance while on exhibition. Your Board have agreed, in view of the probable cost of an adequate granite pedestal for this work, to place it, during the Exposition next year, in Memorial Hall; an application to this effect has been made to the Centennial Art Commission, and an unofficial notice received that, notwithstanding the large demand for space, the most prominent site will be accorded to this work.

Familiar as this noble group will soon become to the eyes of our citizens, it can never lose its merited position in the domain of Art, nor can the criticism which will be expended upon it do more than enhance its value. Your Board have no hesitation in saying it is the finest bronze group in America. As a complete group it is almost perfect, so closely has the genius of the artist followed the original bold conception. The group is finished in bronze, a half-inch in thickness, and weighs about four tons. It consists of a lion, lioness, and two whelps. A dart of the hunter has transfixed the dam, and, "stretched upon the plain," her long sinewy body is relaxing in death. The face of the beast is a study in itself, depicting, with that half-human reality so often seen in the works of Landseer, the mute agony of mortal pain; the maternal instinct, stronger than death, has caused the dying lioness to give her latest strength to the nourishment of her young; over the mother and the whelps stands the lion, the prominent figure of the group, who, with head erect and tail outstretched, roars defiance, grief, and rage; his whole attitude is a study of nature and nature's servant, Art.

At the last meeting of the Board full authority was given to a Committee to remove the group of "Hudson Bay Wolves," by Kemeys, from their present inappropriate site to a more eligible spot, selected, after a judicious examination, near the western terminus of the Girard Avenue Bridge, upon a knoll adjoining the main drive at the Lansdowne entrance to the Park. The works now in possession of the Association, contributed to Fairmount Park, are as follows:

1. Bronze statue, NIGHT, by Shoch. Cast in Philadelphia. Presented to the Association by Edwin N. Benson, Esq. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park April 13, 1872. Erected on George's Hill.

2. Bronze group of HUDSON BAY WOLVES, by Edwin Kemeys. Cast in Philadelphia. Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park September 28, 1872. Erected at Ferndale Pool, West Park.

3. Marble statue, IL PENNEROSO, by Mozier. Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park January 10, 1874. Placed in the Temporary Art Gallery in the Park.

4. Oil painting, THE AMBUSCADE; figures by Baronet Wappers, landscape by Koekkoek. Presented to the Association by Napoleon A. Jennings, Esq. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park January 24, 1874. Placed in the Temporary Art Gallery in the Park.

5. Oil painting, CHALK AND HIS FRIENDS, by Newbold H. Trotter. Presented to the Association by the artist. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park March 21, 1874. Placed in the Temporary Art Gallery in the Park; and

6. THE DYING LIONESS, the disposition of which has been alluded to.

The Board of Trustees regret to state that the Meade Memorial Fund, the management of which was accepted by this Association at the solicitation of a large and influential committee of citizens, has not increased in proportion to the meritorious character of the object. Some part of the apathetic condition of

the fund is due to the Ward Committees, who have made no report of their returns or work, and have apparently abandoned a trust which they accepted. On the other hand, the Board are aware of the active work of some of these committees, who have themselves subscribed, and labored to make the movement a success. By a resolution of your Board, adopted last June, the account of the Meade Memorial Fund was separated from the general account of the Association and a distinct account opened. The balance with interest credited to this account to October 21, 1875, is \$1879.77. It will be remembered that through the exertions of our Association we secured from Congress a donation of twenty twelve-pounder bronze cannons, to be used in the erection of the contemplated Memorial. This gift of the United States the Association still has, and their lowest estimated value is \$7000. Our conditional gift of \$5000 is still outstanding, which, with the sum collected, \$1879.77, makes \$13,879.77. An estimation allows us to state that the subscribed sum of \$15,000 in addition to the above will secure a bronze equestrian statue, $1\frac{1}{3}$ life-size, with pedestal complete, and thus execute the trust the people of Philadelphia have assumed, and confided to this corporation as their agent. Your Board have tried in various ways to keep alive interest in this movement, and from time to time have published what little progress has been achieved. It is a reproach to the citizens of Philadelphia, and detractors have already commented upon it, to suffer this work to languish or be suspended, even amid the many other demands of the approaching Centennial period. The memory of so great and good a man as General Meade should not be another instance of the ingratitude of the Republic, but rather especially dear, and worthy to be preserved and perpetuated by the people of Philadelphia. A decade has scarcely passed since the skill of this soldier, united to the bravery of the army he commanded, stood between Philadelphia and a foe who would have levied a contribution on its inhabitants before which the \$27,500 the Memorial appeals for would appear small indeed.

A resolution of your Board, adopted December 16, 1874,

directed the establishment of a permanent fund, to consist of \$3000, appropriated by this resolve from the general fund in the treasury, the amount to be thereafter paid for Life Membership, and ten per centum of the annual collections, together with all special donations.

This fund, agreeably to this resolution, is instituted, and appears in the Treasurer's Report. The term of office of five Trustees elected to serve in your Board expires to-day. It is your duty this evening to select five more Trustees in their stead, to serve for three years. In concluding this report, your Board see much reason to congratulate the members on the increasing prosperity of the Association. It is but a short time since a few spirited citizens co-operated to form the corporation, which has now a known and established standing in your midst. There are yet many persons outside of the membership who would look with favor on our work. We extend an invitation to every one who desires to see our Park beautified and adorned to join our enterprise.

The coming year will bring together in Philadelphia the largest and perhaps the best collection of works of art, by American and foreign sculptors, that has ever been exhibited in this country. It is exceedingly desirable that a sufficient fund be accumulated to secure to our city, in an enduring form, a number of the finest and most appropriate of these works. Beyond the mere civic pride in possessing these noble creations, there is a more permanent and praiseworthy influence wrought by the appreciation which familiarity with objects of beauty is sure to engender. The existence of this silent influence in a manufacturing city is of vast importance to its artisans and workers, while the whole community shares the effects in the development of an improved taste. This education of the public taste, once the first cost being paid, is accessible to all our people, and as free as the pure air of the Park, and its beneficial results as lasting as time itself. To secure this benefit, however, it is necessary that a hearty co-operation, commensurate with the end in view, be accorded to this Society. We appeal, therefore, again to the

personal influence of each member, and to the public beyond, to make the Association what the dignity of our city seems to demand. Commending the aim and aspirations of the Association to the people of Philadelphia, and trusting to its continued prosperity, we respectfully submit this, our Annual Report.

PREAMBLE TO THE CONSTITUTION.

SINCE it is desirable to increase the appreciation and love of art in our midst ; to add to the number of its votaries, promote the refinements of life consequent thereon, and encourage artists in the practice of their profession ; and

Since it is commendable to erect statues, busts, and other works of art to the honor and memory of eminent persons and their deeds, in order that their good example and influence may be more permanently exerted in fostering a spirit of emulation and ambition in our people ;

And whereas, These results may be better secured, and the good effects thereof more generally obtained, by the accumulation of objects of art in one inclosure visited by the greatest number of people ;

And whereas, It is desirable to enhance the beauties and attractions of the Park by a means in which all may gladly participate ;

Therefore, We, whose names are affixed to the following Constitution, have formed ourselves into a society to be styled the

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION,

which society shall have for its object the accumulation of a fund, by means of annual contributions of small fixed sums of money by the members thereof, and by legacies, donations, etc. ; which fund shall be devoted to and employed in adorning Fairmount Park with works of art, either of a memorial nature or otherwise.

In consideration of the objects above set forth, we, whose names are subscribed to the following Constitution, agree to fulfill with honor and good faith the duties imposed in the said Constitution, and the By-Laws which have been adopted for the rule and government of the said FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.
