Cast in Philadelphia. Presented to the Association by EDWIN N. BENSON, ESQ. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, April 13th, 1872. Erected on George's Hill.

2. "HUDSON BAY WOLVES," Bronze Group
BY EDWARD KEMEYS.

Cast in Philadelphia. Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, September 28th, 1872. Erected at Lansdowne Entrance, West Park.

3. "IL PENSEROSO," Marble Statue
BY MOZIER.

Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, January 10th, 1874. Placed in Horticultural Hall, in the Park.

4. "THE AMBUSCADE," Oil Painting
FIGURES BY BARON WAPPERS. LANDSCAPE BY KOEKKOEK.

Presented to the Association by NAPOLEON A. JENNINGS, ESQ. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, January 24th, 1874. Placed in Memorial Hall, in the Park.

Cast in Munich. Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, December 9th, 1876. Placed in the Concourse on Girard Avenue, in front of the Zoölogical Garden.

7. "DIANA BORGHESE," Terra Cotta Statue

Presented to the Association, December 29th, 1876, by Messrs. H. DOULTON & Co., London, England. Placed in Horticultural Hall, Fairmount Park.

8. "TAM O'SHANTER," { Group of four Figures
in Red Sandstone

BY THOM.

Transferred to the Association by the Trustees of Franklin Institute. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, November 10th, 1877. Placed on the River Drive, under a rustic shelter opposite the boat-houses.

9. DRINKING FOUNTAIN, Granite

Presented to the Association by Mrs. R. D. WOOD. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877. Located on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

10. "FIVE FOUNTAINS," Bronzed Iron

Cast at Paris, France, at the Foundry of Val D'Osne. Purchased by the Association, and erected with basins, hydraulic fittings, &c., at the expense of the Association, in the Park, near the Lincoln Monument. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877.

11. HORSE TROUGH, Italian Marble

Presented by CLARENCE S. KATES. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 15th, 1878, and located on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

12. GRAND FOUNTAIN, Bronze

Purchased by the Association, and erected with basin, hydraulic fittings, &c., at their expense, in the East Park, near the Dauphin Street Entrance. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, June 19th, 1879.

**13. "FOUNTAIN OF ORESTES AND PYLADES,"
Bronze Group**

BY CARL STEINHAEUSER, OF CARLSRUHE, GERMANY.

Cast by Bureau Brothers, Philadelphia. Mounted on a pedestal of Richmond granite, with four streams of water pouring from four bronze masks. Placed near Columbia Avenue Entrance to the East Park, and just south of the great Receiving Reservoir, in September, 1884.

**14. "SILENUS AND THE INFANT BACCHUS,"
Bronze**

Supposed to be a work of Praxiteles, one of the most famous of the ancient Greek sculptors. Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original in the Louvre. Purchased by the Association. Erected on a pedestal of granite, on the east side of the Main Drive, half-way between Fairmount Avenue Entrance and Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

15. "THE WRESTLERS," Bronze Group

Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original antique in the Royal Gallery of Florence, Italy. Presented to the Association by MR. A. J. DREXEL. Mounted on a pedestal of granite on the west side of the Main Drive, at the foot of Lemon Hill, near Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

16. FACE AND HANDS OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN,
Bronze

These casts were taken from the first replicas of the original casts taken from life by Leonard W. Volk, Chicago, April, 1860. Deposited with the Pennsylvania Museum, Memorial Hall, Fairmount Park.

17. "FLORENTINE LIONS," . Bronzed Iron

Cast by Harrison, Winans & Eastwick, at the Imperial Head Mechanical Works at Alexandroffsky, Russia, in 1849. From the pair at the entrance to the Imperial Works which, no doubt, were reproduced from those at the entrance to the Loggia di Lanzi, Florence.

Of the two lions, one is ancient, from the Villa Medica at Rome, the other an imitation by Flaminio Vacca.

SIXTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING.

MINUTES.

Thursday, March 29th, 1888, at 4 o'clock P. M.

THE Sixteenth Annual Meeting of the Fairmount Park Art Association was held at the office of the Commissioners of Fairmount Park.

Mr. Charles J. Cohen called the meeting to order and nominated Honorable Daniel M. Fox as Chairman. Unanimously elected. Mr. C. H. Howell was named Secretary of the meeting. The minutes of the Fifteenth Annual Meeting were read and approved. The Sixteenth Annual Report of the Board of Trustees and Treasurer's Report were read. Mr. Charles Rogers moved that the reports be accepted and that the Secretary be authorized to have 3000 copies published. Carried.

Mr. R. E. Hastings moved that an election of five Trustees be held.

Mr. Edward H. Ogden nominated Thomas Dolan, Henry Pettit, John T. Morris, Alfred G. Hetherington, and Fred-eric Graff.

Mr. C. M. Burns, Jr., moved that the nominations close. Carried. Colonel F. S. Keese moved that the rule be suspended which calls for voting by ballot and that the Secretary be authorized to cast one ballot for the nominees. Agreed to.

The Secretary cast a ballot and the Chair announced the election of the five Trustees named.

The following resolution was adopted: *Resolved*, That the Board of Trustees be recommended to consider the propriety of again creating the office of Assistant Secretary.

A general discussion ensued upon topics of interest to the members of the Association, in which Messrs. C. M. Burns, Jr., F. S. Keese, Leslie W. Miller, J. Raymond Claghorn, Thomas Hockley, Edward H. Ogden, Ferdinand J. Dreer, William Brockie, and Charles Roberts participated.

Mr. Ferdinand J. Dreer suggested that the memory of General Lafayette should be perpetuated in a bronze statue, and announced that he would subscribe \$100 to commence the fund.

Mr. L. W. Miller offered the following: *Resolved*, That it is the sense of this meeting that the charter of this Association should be so amended as to extend its scope to the whole corporate limits of the city of Philadelphia.

Seconded by Mr. Hastings. Carried.

To the Members of the Fairmount Park Art Association :

YOUR Board of Trustees present their Sixteenth Annual Report.

The membership* at this time is as follows :—

Since the publication of the Fifteenth Annual Report the Association has been advised of the death of 36 members; 10 have resigned.

Since the last Annual Meeting 514 new members have been admitted.

The Funds received during the fiscal year were :—

General Fund	\$4,715 10
Permanent Fund	2,272 90
Total	<u>\$6,988 00</u>

* This refers to the Park Branch, the City Branch having been instituted since.

The past year has been the most notable in the career of your Association, in the completion of three of the most important works it has been your privilege to secure and in the acquisition of new members.

This remarkable growth is a subject for congratulation, and encourages your Board to believe that the increasing sentiment in favor of your organization will enable it to accomplish results for which its most sanguine advocates had not ventured to hope.

Your plan has been followed by a number of organizations who desire to adorn their buildings with works of art, and has been singularly successful.

The ceremonies attending the unveiling of the equestrian statue of General Meade form the subject of another pamphlet (No. 20), a copy of which is provided for each member.

Unforeseen events have prevented it from being issued sooner.

The statue reflects great credit upon the talented sculptor Mr. Alexander Milne Calder, who devoted conscientious study to secure historic accuracy without sacrifice of artistic conception or execution.

The portrait of General Meade has won warm approval from those who knew him.

The completed statue is a fitting tribute from grateful Philadelphia to the memory of General Meade and to the valor of those who fought under him.

Mr. John J. Boyle has exhibited in Paris, New York, and Philadelphia his now famous Indian group entitled "The Stone Age in America."

The group has awakened deep interest in those who care to perpetuate in bronze types of the American Indian. In the near future there will be few living representatives of that once powerful race. We may now preserve in enduring form characteristic pictures of their life and lineaments, which will enhance in value and rarity as time advances.

In September of last year, M. August Cain, the eminent French sculptor, delivered his group, "A Lioness Carrying to Her Young a Wild Boar."

This bronze and the "Stone Age in America" were exhibited, through the kindness of Messrs. Haseltine & Co., at their galleries, and have since been in public view on Chestnut street above Ninth, on the sidewalk of the Post Office Building, through the courtesy of the custodian.

They have attracted the admiration of thousands, some of whom have enrolled themselves as members of your organization.

Mr. Augustus St. Gaudens will commence studies of his statue of General Garfield in the near future. He writes: "Preceding commissions have occupied more time than I calculated. I am now at work on the monument which directly precedes you, and when it is finished I will proceed immediately with your commission."

Several excellent opportunities now present themselves for the purchase of works which your Board desire to obtain. Before these objects can be secured, it will be necessary to have an increase of the general fund. At a meeting of the Board held January 6th, 1887, the following minute was adopted:—

"The Board of Trustees of the Fairmount Park Art Association desire to record their deep loss in the death of John Bellangee Cox, which occurred last Tuesday, January 3d, 1888.

"Mr. Cox was one of the original Board of Trustees of this Association, and at its organization in 1871 was elected Secretary. He resigned from this position in 1886 and was made an honorary member. He served continuously until the day of his death.

"Mr. Cox's purity of character, his unfailing interest in the Association, his intelligent comprehension of its aims and

objects, his thorough judgment in all matters that come before it, call for special mention on the minutes of this Association.

“The members of the Board of Trustees also desire to express to Mrs. Cox their sincere personal sorrow and sympathy, and request the Secretary to send her a copy of this minute.”

The Constitution of the Association provides that each of your Trustees shall hold office for the term of three years, and that one-third of the Board shall retire at the close of each year. It is your duty, therefore, to elect to-day, from among the members of the Association, five Trustees to serve for three years and until their successors shall be duly chosen, in place of those whose term of service has expired.

PREAMBLE TO THE CONSTITUTION.

SINCE it is desirable to increase the appreciation and love of art in our midst, to add to the number of its votaries, promote the refinements of life consequent thereon, and encourage artists in the practice of their profession ; and

Since it is commendable to erect statues, busts, and other works of art to the honor and memory of eminent persons and their deeds, in order that their good example and influence may be more permanently exerted in fostering a spirit of emulation and ambition in our people ; and

WHEREAS, These results may be better secured, and the good effects thereof more generally obtained, by the accumulation of objects of art in one enclosure, visited by the greatest number of people ; and

Therefore, We, whose names are affixed to the following Constitution, have formed ourselves into a Society to be styled the

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION,

which Society shall have for its object the accumulation of a fund, by means of annual contributions of small fixed sums of money by the members thereof, and by legacies, donations, etc. ; which fund shall be devoted to and employed in adorning Fairmount Park with works of art either of a memorial nature or otherwise.

In consideration of the objects above set forth, we, whose names are subscribed to the following Constitution, agree to fulfill with honor and good faith the duties imposed in the said Constitution and the By-Laws which have been adopted for the rule and government of the said FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.
