The Fairmount Park Art Association is a society of ladies and gentlemen who desire to embellish Fairmount Park with fountains, statues, busts and similar ornaments, such as good taste shall dictate and the Commissioners of the Park sanction.

All who are animated by a love of the beautiful in Nature and in Art, and have a feeling of pride in the Park—the great ornament of our city—are invited to unite as members, and to contribute to the Association.

Those who are willing to participate in the work and increase the results, are requested to inform the Secretary, who will send for their contributions, or, if preferred, a check sent to the above address will be promptly acknowledged.

Annual Members pay Six Dollars the first year, and Five Dollars after, for either the Park or City Branch. Those who desire to contribute to both funds pay Eleven Dollars the first year and Ten Dollars after. The funds are kept entirely separate, Park funds being expended for works of Art for the Park, and City funds for works of Art for the City.

All contributions for Life Membership, and ten per centum of the annual, are placed in the Permanent Funds, which are to be kept inviolate until they each aggregate \$100,000, when the interest will be used.

1. "NIGHT," **Bronze Statue**
BY EDWARD STAUCH.

Cast in Philadelphia. Presented to the Association by EDWIN N. BENSON, ESQ. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park April 13th, 1872. Erected on George's Hill.

2. "HUDSON BAY WOLVES," **Bronze Group**
BY EDWARD KEMEYS.

Cast in Philadelphia. Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, September 28th, 1872. Erected at Lansdowne Entrance, West Park.

3. "IL PENNEROSO," **Marble Statue**
BY MOZIER.

Purchased by the Association. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, January 10th, 1874. Placed in Horticultural Hall, in the Park.

4. "THE AMBUSCADE," **Oil Painting**
FIGURES BY BARON WAPPERS. LANDSCAPE BY KOEKKOEK.

Presented to the Association by NAPOLEON A. JENNINGS, ESQ. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, January 24th, 1874. Placed in Memorial Hall, in the Park.

5. "CHALK AND HIS FRIENDS," **Oil Painting**
BY NEWBOLD H. TROTTER.

Presented to the Association by the Artist. Accepted by the Commissioners of the Park, March 21st, 1874. Placed in Memorial Hall, in the Park.

12. GRAND FOUNTAIN, . . . Bronzed Iron

Purchased by the Association, and erected with basin, hydraulic fittings, etc., at their expense, in the East Park, near the Dauphin Street Entrance. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, June 19th, 1879.

**13. "FOUNTAIN OF ORESTES AND PYLADES,"
Bronze Group**

BY CARL STEINHAUSER, OF CARLSRUHE, GERMANY.

Cast by Bureau Brothers, Philadelphia. Mounted on a pedestal of Richmond granite, with four streams of water pouring from four bronze masks. Placed near Columbia Avenue Entrance to the East Park, south of the great Receiving Reservoir, in September, 1884.

**14. "SILENUS AND THE INFANT BACCHUS,"
Bronze**

Supposed to be a work of Praxiteles, one of the most famous of the ancient Greek sculptors. Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original in the Louvre. Purchased by the Association. Erected on a pedestal of granite, on the east side of the Main Drive, half-way between Fairmount Avenue Entrance and Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

15. "THE WRESTLERS," . . . Bronze Group

Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original antique in the Royal Gallery of Florence, Italy.

Presented to the Association by Mr. A. J. DREXEL.

Mounted on a pedestal of granite on the west side of the Main Drive, at the foot of Lemon Hill, near Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

**16. FACE AND HANDS OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN,
Bronze**

These casts were taken from the first replicas of the original casts taken from life by Leonard W. Volk, Chicago, April 1860. Deposited with the Pennsylvania Museum, Memorial Hall, Fairmount Park.

17. "FLORENTINE LIONS," . . . Bronzed Iron

Cast by Harrison, Winans & Eastwick, at the Imperial Head Mechanical Works at Alexandroffsky, Russia, in 1849, from the pair at the entrance to the Imperial Works, which, no doubt, were reproduced from those at the entrance to the Loggia di Lanzi, Florence.

Of the two lions, one is ancient, from the Villa Medica at Rome, the other an imitation by Flaminio Vacca.

Presented to the Association by Mrs. A. M.

EASTWICK, widow of a member of that firm. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, April, 1887, and placed near the Welsh Memorial, West Park.

18. EQUESTRIAN STATUE OF GEN. GEORGE GORDON MEADE, . . . Bronze

BY ALEXANDER MILNE CALDER.

Cast by The Henry Bonnard Co., New York. Mounted on a pedestal of Pennsylvania Granite. Placed north of Memorial

Hall. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, October 18th, 1887.

19. "STONE AGE IN AMERICA," . . . Bronze

BY JOHN J. BOYLE.

Placed in West Park, near the Children's Play Ground.

20. "LIONESS CARRYING TO HER YOUNG A WILD BOAR," . . . Bronze

BY AUGUST CAIN.

Placed near the Iron Spring and Lincoln Monument, foot of Lemon Hill.

21. EQUESTRIAN STATUE OF JEANNE D'ARC, . . . Bronze

BY FRÉMIET.

Mounted on granite pedestal. Placed near the eastern approach to Girard Avenue Bridge. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, November 15, 1890.

22. LION FIGHTER, . . . Plaster Cast

BY PROF. ALBERT WOLFF, OF BERLIN.

Being the original cast of this famous colossal equestrian statue. Being cast in bronze for exhibition at the Columbian Exposition, Chicago, before being placed permanently at Fairmount Park.

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.

THE Twentieth Annual Meeting was held November 17th, 1891, at 8 o'clock P. M., at the rooms of The Historical Society of Pennsylvania, 1300 Locust Street.

Mr. Francis M. Brooke called the meeting to order, and nominated Mr. John Sartain as Chairman, who was duly elected, and Mr. Charles H. Howell was made Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Annual Report of the Board of Managers and of the Treasurer were read and accepted.

Mr. Charles W. Sparhawk moved that the Secretary be authorized to have 3,000 copies of the reports printed and circulated. Agreed to.

Mr. Charles M. Burns nominated the following Trustees for three years:—

Joel J. Baily, Thomas Hockley, Henry K. Fox, C. N. Weygandt, William W. Justice.

Mr. F. M. Brooke moved that the nomination close. So ordered.

It was moved that the rule requiring a vote by ballot be suspended, and the Secretary be authorized to cast one ballot for the meeting. Agreed to.

The five Trustees were declared elected.

A general and interesting discussion ensued, touching the interests and prospects of the Association, in which Messrs. J. Raymond Claghorn, Leslie W. Miller, Thomas Hockley, M. Richard Muckle, Charles W. Sparhawk, John Sartain, and others participated.

Mr. L. W. Miller offered the following resolution, secondly Mr. J. Raymond Claghorn: Resolved, that the Fairmount Park Art Association recognize with pleasure the services of the Canstatter Verein and The Goethe Monument Association, in erecting Bronze statues of Schiller and Goethe in Fairmount Park. Adopted.

On motion, adjourned.

The Replica of Barye's famous group, “A Lion Stung by a Serpent,” has been received and is now on exhibition, preparatory to its removal to one of the Public Squares.

It was hoped by your Board that the public, and especially those interested in the work of your Association, would come forward and subscribe the requisite amount of money necessary to complete the fund for the extinguishment of our indebtedness in this connection, \$1,717 04 have already been obtained from members of the City Branch, leaving a deficiency of about \$1,000 to cover cost of group and pedestal.

Your Board would remind you that this work begins the efforts of the City Branch of your Association to beautify the city.

How far these efforts will be successful, depends upon the liberality of the public. An annual membership of twelve hundred in the City Branch, would enable your Board to place a work of art every year in the city, and it is not necessary to point out how desirable the attainment of such a result would be.

As yet nothing has been done in the matter of casting in bronze "The Collossal Equestrian Group," "The Lion Fighter," as the Casting Fund does not amount to \$3,000, which amount must be in hand before giving the commission to proceed. The plaster cast of "The Amazon," is expected at any time in the near future. Your Board trust that means will soon be forthcoming, to make the contract with the bronze founders as fully set forth in the last Annual Report. When cast, these groups will be far the most imposing of any your Association has purchased. The Plaster Model of the "Lion Fighter," remains on exhibition at Memorial Hall in Fairmount Park.

The accumulation of interest on the Grant Fund, warrants your Board in giving a commission for the execution of the equestrian statue of General Grant, which they intend to do this autumn. The statue will be erected in Fairmount Park, as the money was subscribed with this intention. The question is in the hands of the Grant Memorial Committee and Committee on Works of Art, who will report at an early date.

Your Board has the pleasure to announce that by will of the late Alfred Bamber, eight thousand dollars will come to this Association within one year.

In the twentieth year of our existence, we receive this first bequest.

The Constitution of the Association provides that each of your Trustees shall hold office for three years, and that one-third of the Board shall retire at the close of each year. It is therefore your duty to elect to-day five trustees for a period of three years.

Since it is desirable to increase the appreciation and love of art in our midst ; to add to the number of its votaries, promote the refinements of life, consequent thereon, and encourage artists in the practice of their profession, and

Since it is commendable to erect statues, busts, fountains and other works of art to the honor and memory of eminent persons and their deeds, in order that their good example and influence may be more permanently exerted in fostering a spirit of emulation and ambition in our people, and

Whereas, these results may be better secured and the good effects thereof more generally obtained by the accumulation of objects of art in one enclosure, visited by the greatest number of people, and

Whereas, it is desirable to enhance the beauties and attractions of the Park, by means in which all may gladly participate.

Therefore, we, whose names are affixed to the following Constitution, have formed ourselves into a society to be styled the "Fairmount Park Art Association," which society shall have for its object the accumulation of a fund, by means of annual contributions of small fixed sums of money by the members thereof, and by legacies, donations, etc., which fund shall be devoted to and employed in adorning Fairmount Park with works of art, either of a memorial nature or otherwise.

In consideration of the objects above set forth, we, whose names are subscribed to the following Constitution, agree to fulfil with honor and good faith the duties imposed in the said Constitution and the By-Laws, which have been adopted for the rule and government of the said Fairmount Park Art Association.

PREAMBLE.

Since it is desirable to increase the appreciation and love of art in our midst ; to add to the number of its votaries, promote the refinements of life, consequent thereon, and encourage artists in the practice of their profession, and

Since it is commendable to erect statues, busts, fountains and other works of art to the honor and memory of eminent persons and their deeds, in order that their good example and influence may be more permanently exerted in fostering a spirit of emulation and ambition in our people, and

Whereas, these results may be better secured and the good effects thereof more generally obtained by the accumulation of objects of art in one enclosure, visited by the greatest number of people, and

Whereas, it is desirable to enhance the beauties and attractions of the Park, by means in which all may gladly participate.

Therefore, we, whose names are affixed to the following Constitution, have formed ourselves into a society to be styled the "Fairmount Park Art Association," which society shall have for its object the accumulation of a fund, by means of annual contributions of small fixed sums of money by the members thereof, and by legacies, donations, etc., which fund shall be devoted to and employed in adorning Fairmount Park with works of art, either of a memorial nature or otherwise.

In consideration of the objects above set forth, we, whose names are subscribed to the following Constitution, agree to fulfil with honor and good faith the duties imposed in the said Constitution and the By-Laws, which have been adopted for the rule and government of the said Fairmount Park Art Association.
