The Fairmount Park Art Association is a society of ladies and gentlemen who contribute to a fund with which they purchase works of art for the adornment of Fairmount Park. Almost every citizen of note in the past twenty years has been a contributor or member of the Association, and has thus assisted in the laudable desire of adding to the permanent attractions in the Park—attractions which are not only for to-day but for generations to come. It is proposed to secure a good example of the best work of every eminent sculptor. In a few years our Park may boast of more treasures in art than any other public park in the world. The presence of objects of beauty is a great educator, and tends to refine the people and to cultivate their taste for the beautiful. In a manufacturing city this is especially desirable; and the surroundings and influences that ennoble and refine are potent in attracting the cultivated from other places. Whatever can be done to make our city attractive to wealthy and refined travelers is certain to assist in its material prosperity. "The public-spirited men and women who are engaged in this ennobling work are exerting influences which will be felt for centuries."

Recently the charter has been amended authorizing the formation of a "City" Branch for the adornment of City streets and Parks.

Those who are willing to participate are cordially invited to do so, and are requested to inform the Secretary, who will send for their contributions, or, if preferred, a check sent to the above address will be promptly acknowledged.

Annual Members pay Six Dollars the first year, and Five Dollars after, for either the Park or City Branch. Those who desire to contribute to both funds pay Eleven Dollars the first year and Ten Dollars after. The funds are kept entirely separate, Park funds being expended for works of Art for the Park, and City funds for works of Art for the City.

All contributions for Life Membership, and ten per centum of the Annual, are placed in the Permanent Funds, which are to be kept inviolate until they each aggregate \$100,000, when the interest will be used.

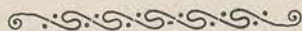

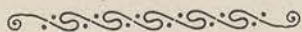

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION

THE Twenty-first Annual Meeting was held Thursday, March 2d, 1893, at noon, at the rooms of Mr. Boldt, Bullitt Building, 141 South Fourth Street, about one hundred members being present.

Mr. Joshua L. Baily called the meeting to order and nominated his Honor, Mayor Edwin S. Stuart, as Chairman, who was duly elected.

Charles H. Howell was made Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Annual Report of the Board of Trustees and of the Treasurer, Mr. Henry K. Fox, were read and accepted.

Mr. J. Bunford Samuel moved that the Board be authorized to have 3,000 copies of the reports printed and circulated. Agreed to.

Mr. Caleb J. Milne nominated the following Trustees for three years:—

Anthony J. Drexel, Frederick R. Shelton, Charles H. Howell, Charles J. Cohen, J. Raymond Claghorn, and for two years, John H. Converse, vice Thomas Hockley, deceased.

Mr. Weygandt moved that the rule requiring a vote by ballot be suspended, and the Secretary be authorized to cast one ballot for the meeting. Agreed to.

The Secretary cast the ballot and the Chair declared that the six Trustees had been duly elected.

Mr. Joshua L. Baily was called to the chair, while his Honor received on behalf of the city the bronze group, "Lion and Serpent," by Barye, now located in Rittenhouse Square.

The presentation address was made by G. Heide Norris, Esq., representing the Association.

An interesting discussion ensued, touching matters of interest to the Society in which Messrs. A. G. Elliot, Charles Roberts, Leslie W. Miller, Abraham S. Patterson, Joshua L. Baily, William J. Donohue and others, took part.

Mr. Leslie W. Miller, of the School of Industrial Art, made an address upon the importance and value of the work being accomplished by your Association. (pp. 18, 19 and 20.)

Mr. John T. Morris invited suggestions from members who might know of works of art worthy of purchase by the Association, in order that the proper committee could consider the propriety of their purchase when in funds. This sort of co-operation would serve to indicate to the Board the wishes of members, and is always acceptable.

A vote of thanks was given the Mayor for so ably presiding at the meeting.

On motion, adjourned. The members were invited to an adjoining room, where luncheon was served.

The Board announces with a high degree of satisfaction that an award for the erection of the Grant Memorial has been made to Daniel Chester French and Edward C. Potter, artists of fame at home and abroad, and in due time an equestrian statue will be placed in the Park fully commensurate with the renown of the hero whose memory it is intended to perpetuate and which, at the same time, will reflect great credit on your Association ; the Special Committee entrusted with this undertaking, in conjunction with your committee on “ Works of Art,” spent much time and serious thought on the matter, and the Board, in endorsing their selection, do not hesitate to congratulate you, as also the community generally, on the prospect of possessing a highly meritorious art work ; as criticism has been made from time to time that encouragement was lacking to the American citizen as a sculptor, it may not be out of place, to accentuate the fact of the American nationality of both Messrs. French and Potter.

The Commission for the Garfield Memorial is still with Augustus St. Gaudens, who has given the subject much consideration ; it has been the wish of the Special Committee to have a design submitted for their approval at an earlier date than this, but such has been prevented by Mr. St. Gaudens being presently occupied with work assumed at a time prior

to the date of your Commission, as also by the important duties devolving upon him in connection with the Art Department of the World's Fair; assurance, however, is given that when we next come together we shall be able to report material progress in the work.

The McClellan and Lafayette funds will be carefully nursed from time to time, and it may be that at no distant date opportunity may offer for their proper increase and final usage.

A contract has been entered into with Messrs. Bureau Bros. of this city to cast in bronze the colossal equestrian group by Prof. Albert Wolff, of Berlin, called "The Lion Fighter," the plaster cast of which has been on exhibition in Memorial Hall; it is intended to have this great work on exhibition at Chicago at the World's Fair, where it will doubtless reflect much credit on your Association.

It has been the fixed policy of the Board of Trustees to faithfully carry out the provisions of your constitution to increase the permanent fund of the Association as rapidly as practicable, and your attention is particularly directed to that item in the abstract of the Treasurer's report noted above; it should be stated, however, that a good part of the increase in the Permanent Fund for the current year arises from the receipt of the bequest made to your Association by the late Alfred Bamber, whose interest in its work during his lifetime was not pronounced, but who evidently recognized the value of the institution in all its varied branches, and allusion is made to this fact at this time not only as recording our appreciation of the munificent gift, but as an exemplar to our community, an example which we may hope to have frequently followed.

The original plaster cast of Kiss' famous colossal equestrian group, "The Amazon," purchased by this Association, was found on examination to be disintegrating to such a degree as to be unsafe for shipment to this country. Whereupon the offer was accepted to have a casting made in plaster from the original bronze, under the auspices of the German Govern-

ment. The work has been finished and is ready for delivery. The kind offices of our Minister to Berlin, Hon. William Walter Phelps, have been asked to view and pass upon the plaster cast and authorize payment therefor.

The following is a copy of a letter from Paris from the office of the Minister of Public Instruction and Fine Arts :

“ The Art Institute of Chicago has decided to order several plaster casts of the masterpieces of contemporaneous French sculpture, but before being placed permanently in the Museum of the Art Institute they will be exhibited in the French section of Fine Arts at the Chicago Exposition.

“ Among the masterpieces which the American committee desire to obtain is a cast of Joan of Arc, by Mr. Frémiet. However, Mr. Frémiet, moved by feelings of great delicacy, is not willing to give authority for the removal of the cast from his studio before having your permission.

“ I hope that you may reach a favorable decision in the interest of International Art, which it is an honor to protect.

“ As the time is very short, I shall be much obliged if you will reply by cable.”

The following cablegram was sent in reply :

“ Granted, with condition that cast be always marked ‘ original in bronze in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia.’ ”

Owing to the frequent necessity for legal advice, which has been gratuitously rendered to your officers by J. Sargeant Price, Esq., the Board, at a meeting held November 22d, 1892, elected Mr. Price General Counsel of the Association. His advice and professional skill were of great value to the officers whenever questions arose involving the liability of the Association to pay taxes to the State, and other legal cases, and your Board feels that the thanks of the Association are due to Mr. Price for his valuable service in this regard.

Other cities, having seen the advantage of systematic efforts in the direction of art collections for park and other out-

door adornment, have made inquiries as to our methods, and we are led to hope and believe that before very many years every important city will follow your example and form a similar organization. It is difficult to imagine the far-reaching results of such a consummation. Our countrymen would then become the most important buyers of sculpture in the world.

As, in your own Association, errors of judgment will at times be made, but the same error is not likely to occur twice, and each year of experience will show an advance in the direction of a higher culture. It may not be inopportune to say that the utmost courtesy is shown to the officers of your Association in the prosecution of their duties, whether at home or abroad, and we take it as an indication that the laudable objects of your organization deserve and receive general commendation and approval.

Recognizing the great loss the Board of Trustees has experienced in the demise of its late fellow member, Thomas Hockley, it is not possible to close this report without allusion to his connection with your Association.

At the time of Mr. Hockley's death the Board, at a special meeting called for the purpose, placed on record its high appreciation of his character and services, and though many months have elapsed since that date, the sense of loss experienced by your Board is no less than at the time to which such was given expression.

The constitution of the Association provides that each of your Trustees shall hold office for three years, and that one-third of the Board shall retire at the close of each year. It is, therefore, your duty to elect to-day five trustees for a period of three years, and one Trustee, vice Thomas Hockley, deceased, for a period of two years.

Remarks by Mr. Leslie W. Miller.

MR. PRESIDENT :—I cannot resist the impulse to make before this meeting adjourns some appeal, however feeble, to all the members present to remember and to do all in their power to make others realize and remember the very great importance of the work of this Association. I take it that it is mainly as reminders of this duty that these meetings are held, and it is something that will bear repeating very often—this word of encouragement and incentive that each one of us should carry to his friends to stimulate interest in a work of such significance as this Association is engaged in.

For, after all, it is not money alone that we want, but popular interest as well. If we have that, the necessary means will surely not be wanting.

The real history of cities, or of peoples, is not that partial and prejudiced account which is given of their doings by the story tellers who come after them ; it is the record which the people themselves leave in the places that they have inhabited, and on which they have left the impress of their character.

The future will know us—will know the truth about us—by reading the record that we shall leave behind us in the streets and structures and open places of Philadelphia. What manner of men we are ; what ideals we cherished ; what aspirations we were dominated by—these will appear, whether we like it or not, whether we are conscious of contributing to the record or not, in the monuments which will remain when we are gone. To do the best we can to make these memorials worthy ones and such as we would wish to be judged by is to have public spirit and to care for art in its noblest forms.

This association aims, as few organizations among us do, to ennoble Philadelphia. Depend upon it, posterity will praise us for what this body is doing, and will profit by its efforts in a sense, and to a degree that it is hard for us to realize.

We hear a good deal now-a-days about a newly-awakened public and civic pride and we dream of what the "New Philadelphia" is coming to be. I tell you, sir, that the new Philadelphia is not to be made by bridging the Delaware, or by a belt-line railroad; not by building a canal to New York or bigger hotels at home; nor yet by the granting of "stop-over" privileges to travelers by railroad.

It is not in such ways as these that the grandeur and dignity of a city is most effectively promoted, but by laboring for those things which make for higher ideals of life and thought.

Nothing symbolizes so effectively in outward things this higher aim as do good works of monumental art, as nothing is so powerful a reminder, to the busy crowds that throng the streets of the city of to-day, of the sources of enduring pleasure, and of the things that are best worth working for in this hard and sordid life of ours; nothing points so truly to the real sources of interest in creative industry, and nothing, certainly, does so much to cultivate the sentiments on which all civilization and all refinement depend.

We cannot live forever on the record of William Penn and Benjamin Franklin, if we care for the good name, or even for the material prosperity, of our city. We must do what we can to add to the things whose possession gives her dignity and worth.

From a purely economic point of view such work as this association is doing is of incalculable benefit.

We are an industrial community. It is the proudest boast of the Philadelphia of to-day, not that she was once the centre of culture and commerce in America, but that she *is*

the ideal industrial city, with industries the richest and most varied, and an industrial population the most contented and happy that even happy America has to show.

What can we do to perpetuate and develop this character? The answer is not far to seek.

The very centre and soul of contented and successful industry is the artistic spirit; cultivate that if you would fan the flame that means life and energy in all industrial concerns.

This is a lesson that we are slowly learning, and no city is richer than ours in institutions devoted to art education, but the direct and formal instruction is not enough. The air of the city itself should be laden with the influence that art alone can exert. I am not sure that this unconscious influence of the inanimate things about us is not the most important thing in art education, and that we could do without almost anything else rather than this.

Let us do what we can then to make the streets and parks of our city beautiful, not only for the purpose of attracting desirable residents and visitors, but as a means of nourishing the deepest and most vital sources of our industrial energy.

In serving this Association, then, I am sure we serve alike higher ideals in the life of our people and make surer the material health and prosperity of the city that we all love so well.

At a special meeting of the Board of Trustees the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That in the judgment of this Board, it would, for artistic considerations, be a grave mistake to place the Washington Monument in Independence Square, and one which would be plainly evident when too late to rectify it.

The reasons against erecting the Monument in Independence Square have been clearly and forcibly set forth in the protests already made. This Board, in fully endorsing these protests, is actuated by the same motives which it has always had in mind throughout the twenty years of its existence, and in which it has been so constantly sustained by its thirteen hundred members, namely: A feeling of pride in the Park and City, and a desire that the best Works of Art, best placed, should be among the chief attractions of Philadelphia.

Resolved, That the Chairman of the Committee on Works of Art (Mr. Hockley) with the Secretary of the Association be appointed a Committee to wait upon the Mayor and to present the foregoing resolution duly attested.

Whereas, these results may be better secured and the good effects thereof more generally obtained by the accumulation of objects of art in one enclosure, visited by the greatest number of people ; and,

Whereas, it is desirable to enhance the beauties and attractions of the Park, by means in which all may gladly participate ;

Therefore, we, whose names are affixed to the following Constitution, have formed ourselves into a society to be styled the "Fairmount Park Art Association," which society shall have for its object the accumulation of a fund, by means of annual contributions of small fixed sums of money by the members thereof, and by legacies, donations, etc., which fund shall be devoted to and employed in adorning Fairmount Park with works of art, either of a memorial nature or otherwise.

In consideration of the objects above set forth, we, whose names are subscribed to the following Constitution, agree to fulfil with honor and good faith the duties imposed in the said Constitution and the By-Laws, which have been adopted for the rule and government of the said Fairmount Park Art Association.
