FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.

The Fairmount Park Art Association is a society of men, women and children who contribute to a fund with which to purchase works of art for the adornment of Fairmount Park and the City of Philadelphia. Almost every citizen of note in the past twenty-five years has been a member of the Association, and has thus assisted in the laudable desire of adding to the permanent attractions in the Park—attractions which are not only for to-day, but for generations to come. It is proposed to secure a good example of the best work of every eminent sculptor. In a few years our Park may boast of more treasures in art than any other public park in the world. The presence of objects of beauty is a great educator, and tends to refine the people and to cultivate their taste for the beautiful. In a manufacturing city this is especially desirable, impressing itself upon artisans, and elevating the character and artistic tone of their products. The surroundings and influences that ennoble and refine are potent in attracting the cultivated from other places. Whatever can be done to make our city attractive to wealthy and refined travelers is certain to assist in its material prosperity. "The public-spirited men and women who are engaged in this ennobling work are exerting influence which will be felt for centuries."

In 1888 the formation of a "City" Branch for the adornment of City Streets and Parks was established.

All who are willing to participate are cordially invited to do so, and are requested to inform the Secretary, who will send for their contributions, or, if preferred, a check to his address will be promptly acknowledged.

Annual members pay Five Dollars yearly to either the Park or City Branch. Those who desire to contribute to both funds pay Ten Dollars per annum. The funds are kept entirely separate, Park funds being expended for works of Art for Fairmount Park, and City funds for works of Art for the City.

All Contributions for Life and Perpetual Memberships and ten per centum of the Annual, are placed in the Permanent funds, which are to be kept inviolate until they each aggregate \$100,000, when the interest alone will be used.

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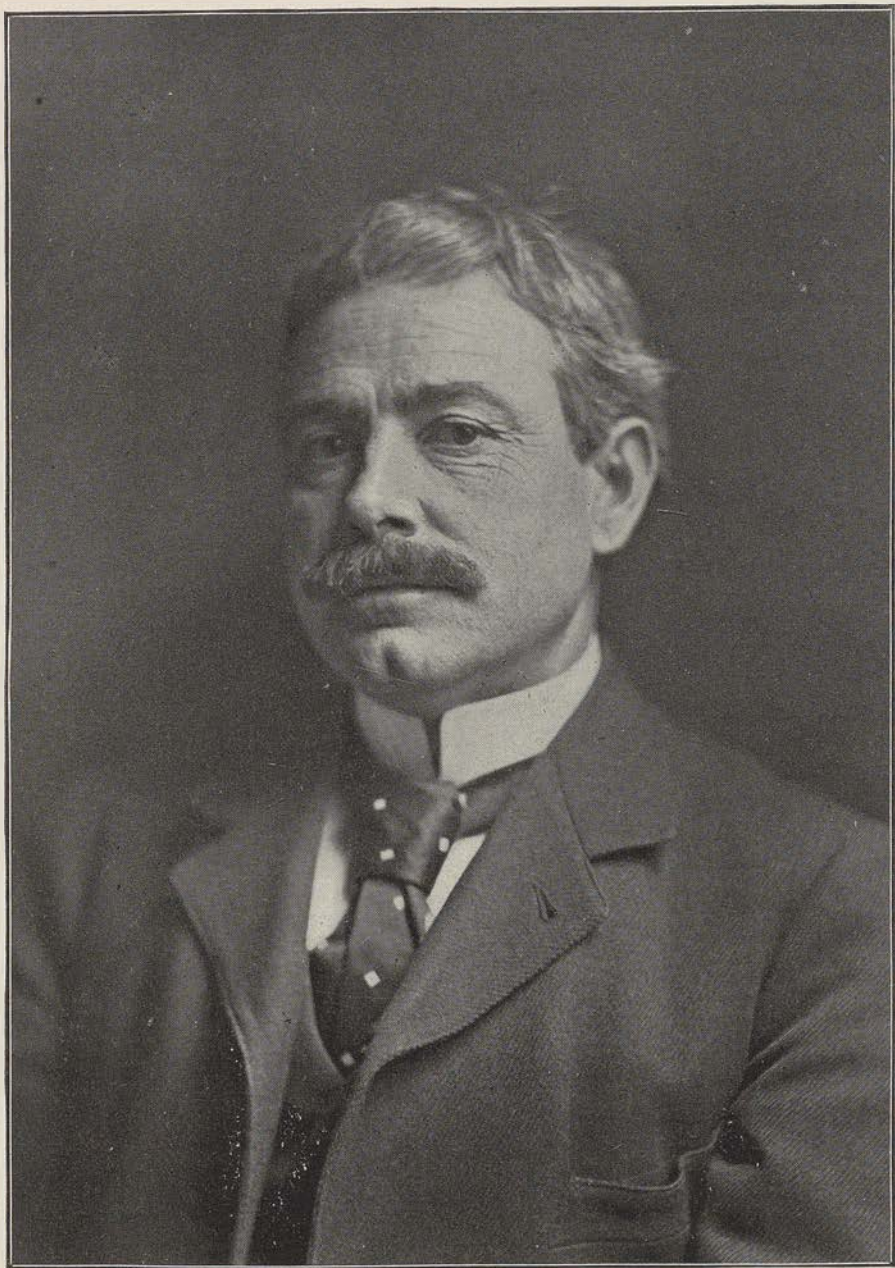

9. **DRINKING FOUNTAIN,** **Granite**

Presented to the Association by MRS. R. D. WOOD. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877. Placed on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

10-14. **FIVE FOUNTAINS,*** **Bronzed Iron**

Cast at Paris, France, at the Foundry of Val D'Osne. Purchased by the Association, and erected with basins, hydraulic fitments, etc., at the expense of the Association, in the Park near the Lincoln Monument. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877.

15. **HORSE TROUGH,** **Italian Marble**

Presented by CLARENCE S. KATES. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 15th, 1878, and placed on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

16. **GRAND FOUNTAIN** **Bronzed Iron**

Purchased by the Association and erected with basin, hydraulic fitments, etc., at the expense of the Association, in the East Park, near the Dauphin Street Entrance. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, June 19th, 1879.

17. **FOUNTAIN OF "ORESTES AND PYLADES,"** **Bronze Group**

BY CARL STEINHAEUSER, OF CARLSRUHE, GERMANY.

Cast by Bureau Brothers, Philadelphia. Mounted on a pedestal of Richmond granite, with streams of water pouring from four bronze masks. Placed near Columbia Avenue Entrance to the East Park, south of the great Receiving Reservoir, in September, 1884.

18. **"SILENUS AND THE INFANT BACCHUS."** - - - **Bronze**

Supposed to be a work of Praxiteles, the most famous of the ancient Greek sculptors. Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original in the Louvre. Purchased by the Association. Erected on a pedestal of granite, on the east side of the Main Drive, half-way between Fairmount Avenue Entrance and Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

*Two have been placed near East River Drive below Girard Avenue Bridge.

19. "THE WRESTLERS," - - - Bronze Group

Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original antique in the Royal Gallery of Florence, Italy. Presented to the Association by MR. A. J. DREXEL. Mounted on a pedestal of granite, on the west side of the Main Drive, at the foot of Lemon Hill, near Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

20. FACE AND HANDS OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN, - Bronze

These casts were taken from the first replicas of the original casts taken from life by Leonard W. Volk, Chicago, April, 1860. Deposited with the Pennsylvania Museum, Memorial Hall, Fairmount Park.

21-22. "FLORENTINE LIONS," - - - Bronze

Cast by Harrison, Winans & Eastwick at the Imperial Head Mechanical Works, at Alexandroffsky, Russia, in 1849, from the pair at the entrance to the Imperial Works, which, no doubt, were reproduced from those at the entrance to the Loggia di Lanzi, Florence. Of the two lions, one is ancient, from the Villa Medica at Rome, the other an imitation by Flaminio Vacca. Presented to the Association by MRS. A. M. EASTWICK, widow of a late member of the above firm. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, April, 1887, and placed near the Welsh Memorial, West Park.

23. HEROIC EQUESTRIAN STATUE OF MAJOR GEN.
GEORGE GORDON MEADE, Bronze
BY ALEXANDER MILNE CALDER.

The United States Government donated a number of captured cannon, and the Legislature of the State of Pennsylvania appropriated the sum of \$5000 toward the expense of the granite pedestal; special subscriptions, largely aided by the Women's Auxiliary Committee, completed the fund necessary for its erection.

Cast by The Henry Bonnard Company. Mounted on a pedestal of Pennsylvania granite. Placed north of Memorial Hall. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, October 18th, 1887, and unveiled with ceremonies participated in by representatives of the military and naval forces of the United States, the Grand Army of the Republic, the National Guard, and by distinguished citizens.

24. "STONE AGE IN AMERICA," - Indian Group, Bronze
BY JOHN J. BOYLE.

Mr. Boyle's spirited group represents an Indian mother defending her children from an attack of wild beasts. A bear's cub, which she has killed with her stone hatchet, lies at her feet, and with her baby clasped to her breast she awaits the attack of the savage mother. The group is among the most masterly works which have been added to the works in the Park, and Mr. Boyle is undoubtedly the first sculptor who has adequately presented the Indian's case in American art. It was cast by Barbedienne, of Paris, and placed in West Park, near the Children's Play Ground, in 1888.

 BY PROF. ALBERT WOLFF, OF BERLIN.
 Cast in bronze by Bureau Bros., 1893. Placed on natural jutting rock, East River Drive below Girard Avenue Bridge, June, 1897.

Daniel Baugh, Esq., presided, and Charles H. Howell acted as Secretary.

The minutes of the Twenty-fifth Annual Meeting and the Twenty-sixth Annual Report of the Board of Trustees were read and approved. The report of the Treasurer, Henry K. Fox, was presented and ordered to be placed on file.

Upon motion of Col. Mucklé the reports were ordered to be accepted, and to be referred to the incoming Board, and that three thousand copies of the same be printed as usual.

The following members were elected to the Board of Trustees for the term ending October 31, 1900: Messrs. Joel J. Baily, John H. Converse, Henry K. Fox, C. N. Weygandt, William W. Justice.

The presiding officer addressed the meeting, concluding by introducing Doctor James MacAlister, who, by request of the Board of Trustees, had prepared and read a minute on the death of the late John Sartain, which, on motion, was ordered to be entered on the proceedings of the twenty-sixth Annual Meeting, and that a copy be prepared and delivered to the family of Mr. Sartain.

Ernest Seton Thompson, Esq., of New York, delivered an address on "The Art of the Stone Age," illustrated with stereopticon views; a synopsis appears on a subsequent page.

On the completion of the lecture those present partook of refreshments.

Announcement is made with great satisfaction that the pedestal for the equestrian statue of General Grant has been completed, and the statue is placed in its permanent position; it being late in the season, it is proposed that the unveiling shall take place on "Grant Day," April 27th, 1898, as it is considered that the occasion may be made one of suitable recognition of the fame of the great soldier.

As stated in the last report the City Councils of Philadelphia appropriated \$5,000 for the pedestal, about one-half the sum required, and it is earnestly expected and desired that this may be enlarged by a subsequent gift from the Councils in order that the City Government may have the honor of completing this fitting memorial to this most famous commander.

"The Lion Fighter," by Albert Wolff, of Berlin, was placed, in June last, on a jutting rock overhanging the East River Drive, below Girard Avenue Bridge.

The natural rock, instead of a pedestal, has proven a great innovation, as was confidently hoped; it gives to the work a fitness and grandeur that could be obtained in no other way.

Under the plinth of the statue, and resting on the flat surface of the rock, a specially prepared box of bronze, hermetically sealed, has been placed; in this box were deposited the following:

My Dear Sir:—

I received your kind letter of the 22d instant, in which you say that in a few days the statue of the Lion Fighter will be erected on the River Drive, in Fairmount Park. Let me take this occasion to commend the work of the Fairmount Park Art Association. Every true Philadelphian must appreciate with a sense of gratitude the efforts you have made for the adornment of our city.

Nothing testifies to the refinement of our people as the erection of these works of art in our public places.

It has been my privilege, within two weeks past, to have accepted on behalf of the city two monuments, one erected at the Green Street Entrance of the Park by the Society of the Cincinnati, to the memory of George Washington, and the other on the west side of the City Hall by the Alumni of Girard College and citizens, to the memory of Philadelphia's greatest philanthropist, Stephen Girard.

It has never fallen to the lot of any one Mayor before my time to have accepted such beautiful memorials on behalf of our beloved city.

This may be the beginning of a movement to make Philadelphia the art centre of our country. It is my ardent wish that this consummation may be reached, and that the Fairmount Park Art Association can do and is doing much in this direction.

The Commissioners of Fairmount Park having finally accepted the terms of the bequest of the late Richard Smith, \$500,000 becomes available for the erection of a Soldiers' and Sailors' Gateway under the auspices of this Society. The Fortieth street entrance to the West Park having been designated as the site, Mr. John B. Gest, the Trustee, and Mr. James H. Windrim, the Architect, selected by the testator, invited your Association to appoint a Committee to confer with them as to the selection of sculptors to produce the equestrian statues and other art work to be placed on the

memorial. It is intended to have examples of the best sculpture this generation offers, and since America can claim today such a galaxy of brilliant workers in the plastic art, an early completion of this memorial may be looked for.

With a view of obtaining seats for the parade in honor of the unveiling of the Washington Monument a committee was appointed to secure suitable facilities for this purpose.

Through the courtesy of Frank M. Riter, Director of Public Safety, the Committee obtained a stand at the southeast corner of Twenty-fifth and Green streets, containing 950 seats, all of which were disposed of to members at the price of one dollar each. Miss Pendleton, Chairman of Entertainment Committee, suggested and directed the decoration of the stand.

The rental and other expenses were paid by the receipts from the sale of seats.

With much regret your Board of Trustees announces the death of George B. Roberts, Vice-President, and also that of J. Sergeant Price, Counsellor of the Association. It has placed upon its minutes a fitting expression of its regard and esteem and appreciation of the services of its late officers.

It is a sad duty that has become necessary for your Board to perform. On October 25th, 1897, occurred the death of John Sartain, a very distinguished artist and most prominent member of the Fairmount Park Art Association. An eminent member has consented to prepare a worthy tribute to his memory.

The memorial to Robert Morris has been inaugurated by the appointment of a Committee that will soon formulate plans for obtaining the necessary sum of money, and also for the selection of the artist. Philadelphia is justly proud of her history in the days of the Revolution, and should take particular interest in the completion of this memorial, typifying the noble career of self-sacrifice of one of her greatest sons.

For the City Branch arrangements have been finally concluded with Frank Edwin Elwell, the distinguished American sculptor, for the purchase of his unrivalled group in

bronze of "Charles Dickens and Little Nell." As the amount required for its purchase has not been completed, we would ask practical financial help from those interested in the adornment of the city through the City Branch, or to the special fund for the purchase of the Dickens group, and especially those who would desire to perpetuate in enduring bronze the form and features of the greatest of modern novelists, who, aside from the entertainment afforded to millions, has probably won, by his pen, more benefits to humanity than any writer of his age.

The Permanent Fund approaches the sum of seventy thousand dollars, and your Board is exceedingly anxious to bring the amount up to at least one hundred thousand dollars in order that by a rule of your Board the annual income therefrom may be available for art purposes.

Six perpetual members, contributing \$500 each, have been enrolled in the Park Branch, and as the whole number required is not more than fifty, as also two hundred additional life members of the Park Branch, at \$50 each, to make the income of the Permanent Fund available, it is hoped that by the close of the next fiscal year of the Association the sum may have been secured.

Acknowledgment is made to the press for its valuable help freely given in the interest of the Association.

It is your duty to elect to-day, from among the members of the Association, five Trustees, to serve for three years and until their successors shall be duly chosen, in place of those whose term of service has expired.

DANIEL BAUGH, Esq., addressed the meeting as follows: "I desire to say that not only do I feel personally gratified, but I feel that the Art Club has been honored by the selection of its President as the presiding officer on the twenty-sixth anniversary of the formation of the Fairmount Park Art Association. I regret that there are not more present this evening, but I feel that the absence of a great many of our friends can be accounted for on the score of the weather. But those that are here bear testimony to the earnestness and the progress which has always marked the annual meetings of the Fairmount Park Art Association. It has been the habit of a good many of us to say, during the last decade, that things pertaining to art have made very considerable progress in this community. We find ourselves saying that a great many of our citizens are directly and intelligently interested in the progress of art. They speak more intelligently of it, and they are more discriminating in the selection of works of art for the adornment of their own homes than they used to be, especially in the department of sculpture. I think that the present growing and marked advance in the appreciation of works of sculpture is very distinctly owing to the progress of the work of the Fairmount Park Art Association. And yet—and I do not now refer to the few people who are here to-night—when we look over this catalogue, and see the names of those who are annual subscribers and life members of this Association, it seems to me that our self-complacency in the matter of the progress of art in this town receives a shock, because the names here are entirely out of proportion to what we should expect of a great cityful of people, whose aim and whose ideas are for the advancement of art and art tastes and art culture in the community. The few who are gathered here to-night

will receive the inspiration and enthusiasm that has marked all other annual meetings of this Association. We resolve to do great things, we feel encouraged for the time being, and yet—and I speak for myself very positively—I fear that after the meeting is over, and after the occasion passes from our mind, we do not hold the proper sort of fidelity to this organization. In our intercourse with men who have not probably given any thought to the practical working of this Association, we neglect to drop a word in season to them, and ask them to give their personal effort, their attention, and their interest to that which is aimed to beautify our city and make it distinctly attractive. Now if we, each of us, would carry with us throughout the year the inspiration and the encouragement that we feel in the work while we are attending these meetings, and would speak of that work in season to other citizens, men and women whom we know are interested and progressive, and who would be glad to add their subscriptions to this Association, I am sure that this list, which I do think, in comparison with the number of people in this city, is a very meagre one, might be very largely increased; and I hope we will take it to ourselves not to bore people, but simply to suggest to our friends, as we meet them and have intercourse with them in the busy walks of life, that they can do something for the advancement of the Fairmount Park Art Association.”

DR. JAMES MACALISTER:

“At the request of the Board of Trustees of the Association, I have prepared a minute on the death of our honored and respected member, John Sartain. I wish that this duty might have been enjoined upon some one who had known Mr. Sartain longer than I have, but, after an acquaintance of fifteen years, I feel that I might well comply with the request of the Secretary.”

JOHN SARTAIN.

It is not often that a society is called upon to regret the loss of a member who has rendered it services so worthy of recognition as those of John Sartain to the Fairmount Park Art Association, and the following minute is presented as an expression of the sentiments of its members:

John Sartain was born in London, England, in 1808. He came to the United States in 1830, and settled soon afterwards in Philadelphia, where he lived continuously until his death, October 25th, 1897, in the eighty-ninth year of his age.

From early manhood Mr. Sartain's whole life was devoted to the prosecution of the art of engraving, in which he attained a position second to no other in the history of the art in this country. He was among the first to introduce mezzotint, and his finest achievements were in that form of the engraver's art. He will be remembered for the admirable plates he produced in the earlier years of his career; but until the very last his work showed that his hand had not lost its cunning, nor his mind the refined tastes which characterized everything which it inspired.

But Mr. Sartain was not only an artist. He was one of the pioneers in improving the character of our periodical literature, and he did much in introducing pictorial illustration as a distinctive feature of the American magazine.

Not less worthy of notice is the important and valuable service he rendered as an active worker in every movement calculated to give Art a larger place and a deeper influence in society. He was a useful member in the governing bodies of the School of Design for Women and the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; he was intrusted with the management of the Art Department of the Centennial Exposition of 1876, and discharged the duties of that onerous position with credit to himself and to the satisfaction of the foreign nations participating—receiving from them honors and decorations

in acknowledgment of his meritorious service; and his advice was always sought in public undertakings of an artistic character in Philadelphia.

As a man and a citizen he was esteemed for his high personal character; he took a profound interest in everything directed to promoting the well-being, and increasing the happiness of his fellow men; he was loved by all who came within the influence of his genial and attractive nature.

For all that he was, and for all that he did, he will be long and gratefully remembered here in his own home and wherever his name has penetrated.

As a mark of respect for his memory, and in recognition of his services as a member of this Association, it is ordered that this minute be spread upon its records, and that a copy be sent by the Secretary to his family.

GEORGE B. ROBERTS.

The Board of Trustees of Fairmount Park Art Association, assembled on this occasion to commemorate the twenty-fifth anniversary of its incorporation, feels impelled to declare and to record its loss in the demise of George B. Roberts, one of the Vice-Presidents of the Association.

Showing a very active interest in everything which tended to benefit the city of Philadelphia, and especially in the work to which this Association is devoted, Mr. Roberts has given his time quite freely toward the sustaining of its various interests.

A strong and impressive personality rendered his companionship especially interesting, whilst a mature judgment and fine critical taste were of great value in the development of that art which is sought for to dignify the city.

JOHN SERGEANT PRICE.

The Board of Trustees, Fairmount Park Art Association, desires to enter upon its minutes the record of the demise of J. Sergeant Price, Counsellor of the Association, who, as an officer of the Board, had for a number of years rendered the Association important and valuable services leading to its success in every manner within his power. With ripe judgment and intelligent direction, his counsel was always freely and generously granted, showing a specially active interest in Fairmount Park and in the work in which the Association is engaged.

THE ART OF THE STONE AGE, OR EARLIEST
KNOWN DRAWINGS.

Syllabus of illustrated lecture by Ernest Seton Thompson, Esq., of New York.

The lecture is a discussion of the artistic and historical value of a large number of drawings done by the savages of the Stone Age. These drawings, now shown in *fac-simile* on a screen, were discovered chiefly in the bone caves of Southern Europe. They are the work of the Old Stone Age men, and are by many thousands of years the oldest known examples of human art. They are so numerous that they enable us to reconstruct in a measure the history of the artists, and are of singular interest as drawings. The subjects chiefly represented are animals—the Reindeer, the Wild Horse, Wild Bull, Bison, Ibex, Chamois, Bear, Mammoth, and all the ordinary beasts of the chase.

The drawings are on pieces of ivory, deer-horn, bone and slate, and are etched with a sharp flint.

They illustrate in a remarkable manner the origin and ultimate trend of art, and, though the work of naked savages, have much in common with the etching of the modern masters.

JOHN J. BOYLE.

In the parish of St. Stephen's Catholic Church I was christened a few days after my birth in New York City, about the middle of January, in the early fifties. The first-born of an early marriage, my father was a stone worker, and, in fact, my ancestors on both sides were mechanics, living in the North of Ireland; my mother's, iron workers, and my father's, as far back as any of the family remembers, stone workers and builders.

A few months after seeing the light, my father decided to come to Philadelphia, where two of his brothers lived, one an apprentice. My father worked on two churches in Philadelphia, and then went out to the Allegheny Mountains, spending six years at Kittaning, Gallitzin, and the Summit. After that he started for West Virginia to work during the winter, but he lost his life the first day of his visit, and is buried there. After a few months' stay in Virginia, my brother and I were brought to Philadelphia, and left with my uncle, that we might be sent to school.

In early life I had always hoped to be a machinist. Not getting a position easily, I secured an apprenticeship at stone-cutting; thus began my first lessons in the art of sculpture.

At the age of twenty-one I was a tolerably good stone-cutter, so I went in at once for stone-carving. In the meanwhile I spent some time at drawing school, endeavoring to model, and studying with Mr. Eakins and Mr. Bailey at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts the first season it was open. By this time I had saved enough to take me to Paris, where I entered the Ecole des Beaux Arts, spending three years there. I made rapid progress, receiving a medal before the end of my second year, and at all times great encouragement from my professors.

In the summer of 1878 I decorated a leather exchange in London with five panels and caryatids. At the Salon of 1879 I exhibited a bronze bust, and, besides other work, executed two portraits for Baltimore. In the spring of 1880 I received

a commission for the group called "An Indian Family," and spent two months among the Indians who were to be represented. This group, the gift of Mr. Martin Ryerson, was presented in May, 1884, and is now in Lincoln Park, Chicago.

When "An Indian Family" was exhibited in Philadelphia, where it was executed, its excellence impressed many, and a feeling prevailed that the Fairmount Park Art Association would do well to have a similar group executed for the Association, and to that end they gave me a commission. This group, "The Stone Age," was begun in Paris in the summer of 1884, exhibited in plaster at the Salon of 1886, receiving a Mention Honorable, and was also shown in bronze in 1887, when it would doubtless have received a medal but for the unwarranted prejudices which existed at that time on account of the duty on art. The work was delivered in Philadelphia in the autumn of 1887, and erected in Fairmount Park the following summer.

During the summer of 1886 I visited Switzerland, and spent eight months in Italy. While in Paris, two portraits, one in bronze, and one in marble, were executed. From 1887 to 1891 were the darkest and most distressing years of my life, all the work I did during that time being some book illustrations. In 1891 I was asked to go to Chicago, and in the spirit in which it was proposed, decided to participate in the great work there, which, as all the world knows, was an eminent success.

Family ties and the hand of hope brought me back to Philadelphia again in the autumn of 1893, after two very happy years in Chicago, and in the art world at large. During the years 1894 to 1895 I finished two statues for the Congressional Library at Washington, those of Sir Francis Bacon and Plato, and, as every artist would feel, was justly proud of the honor conferred upon me by my government. During this time three heroic busts, one for the University of Pennsylvania, one for Bryn Mawr College, and one for the First Unitarian Church, were executed, as were also two portraits for the Hahnemann Hospital and for the Penn Charter School.

COMMUNICATION
CONCERNING THE "LION FIGHTER."

From Leslie W. Miller to the Editor of "*The Evening Telegraph*."

BARCLAY H. WARBURTON,
Proprietor of *The Evening Telegraph*:

No one, I am sure, accords more heartily than I do the right of the editorial tongue to be as sharp as it pleases in passing judgment on works of art which are to be set up in public places. Even in the case of Wolff's "Lion Fighter," which has just been placed in Fairmount Park, and which you condemned in such unmeasured terms a few days ago, I have no disposition to raise an issue with you regarding any question of merit in the work itself. It may, or it may not, deserve all the denunciation which you lavish upon it; but nothing is perfect in this world, and the statue in question probably has its full share of faults, and can fairly stand its full share of criticism. At the same time, you will perhaps allow me to make a modest explanation, and even to enter a mild protest regarding a few of the points which you raise, the discussion of which, in a little broader spirit than that which the zealous critic relies on to render his shafts effective, may perhaps be regarded as not altogether untimely.

You take the Fairmount Park Art Association seriously to task for "alleging" that the group in question is a companion of the "Amazon Struggling with a Panther," by Augustus Kiss, which statement you declare to be "an allegation for which the Art Association cannot afford to stand responsible. It is an impudent assumption, offensive to a great artist and a great work of art, which should be withdrawn officially by the Association with such reparation as the most ample and most regretful apologies can afford. The so-called 'Lion Fighter' is no more a companion for the immortal 'Amazon,' than a stove casting figure is a companion

for the Venus of Milo, and the humbugging pretense is so glaringly false, and so aggressively evident on sight, that it is safe to say no intelligent member of the Fairmount Park Art Association would risk his reputation in defending it for an instant."

The originals of these two groups stand together as companion pieces on the steps of the National Museum in Berlin. There is no claim, or pretense, or allegation about it. There the two statues stand, and have stood for years, companions, in nearly as strict a sense, as far as architectural effect is concerned, as the two Pegasi which flank the entrance to Memorial Hall.

It is in this sense, and this only, that the two works have been repeatedly mentioned as companions in the publications of the Association. If the critical judgment that has assigned this relationship to them as works of art is at fault, let us say so as frankly as we please, but let us put the blame where it belongs—namely, with the authorities of the Berlin Museum, not with the Fairmount Park Art Association.

So much for the classification to which you object. But I should be glad to say a word or two regarding the public, and even the editorial, duty with reference to that form of artistic censorship of which the article from which I have quoted above is so good an example. I am not going to "risk my reputation" by defending either the pretended companionship between these two works or the merits of Wolff's group, of which you have given us your opinion in such unequivocal terms; but I would like, in all modesty, to raise the question whether there is not more danger of going too far, and of doing real harm to art by giving rein to this tendency to denounce unsparingly the things that we cannot unreservedly approve, than there would be in pursuing a more moderate, not to say a more merciful, course. The "Lion Fighter" in question belongs to that rather large and, on the whole, useful class of pseudo-classical compositions which embody all the merits that are really teachable, and which show, therefore,

just how far art can be carried by obedience to respected canons and the guidance of perfectly trained, but uninspired, masters. In other words, it is a triumph of the conventional; a masterpiece of the academic. It is very fairly characteristic of what the German influence has always stood, and still stands, for, and it is perhaps worth preserving as a type of the excellencies which scholarly Germany has from the first honored and fostered.

The question arises, then, Is art to be served, and its interests in a community promoted, most efficiently by encouraging, or by denouncing, the setting up in public places of such works as this? Frankly, it seems to me that what we want to do is to quicken and strengthen the habit of doing just such work as the Fairmount Park Art Association has done in erecting this group, not to discourage and disparage it. We have little enough such energy among us, in all conscience; let us cultivate it, not crush it, as there is danger of doing by criticism that is too strongly destructive in character. All works of art, even from the hands of the greatest masters, are not masterpieces. It is not always high tide, nor always twelve o'clock; but let us not curse the moon or stop the clock on that account. On the contrary, let us say a good word for them both, and do our little part to keep those influences active which it is in our power to promote or to destroy. Art cannot spare even the little masters, and the pressing need of the world is not to measure the degrees of difference between the greater and the less so much as to realize its own indebtedness to both.
