FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.

The Fairmount Park Art Association is a society of men, women and children who contribute to a fund with which to purchase works of art for the adornment of Fairmount Park and the City of Philadelphia. Almost every citizen of note in the past twenty-seven years has been a member of the Association, and has thus assisted in the laudable desire of adding to the permanent attractions in the Park—attractions which are not only for to-day, but for generations to come. It is proposed to secure a good example of the best work of every eminent sculptor. In a few years our Park may boast of more treasures in art than any other public park in the world. The presence of objects of beauty is a great educator, and tends to refine the people and to cultivate their taste for the beautiful. In a manufacturing city this is especially desirable, impressing itself upon artisans, and elevating the character and artistic tone of their products. The surroundings and influences that elevate and refine are potent in attracting the cultivated from other places. Whatever can be done to make our city attractive to wealthy and refined travelers is certain to assist in its material prosperity. "The public-spirited men and women who are engaged in this ennobling work are exerting influence which will be felt for centuries."

In 1888 the formation of a "City" Branch for the adornment of City Streets and Parks was established.

All who are willing to participate are cordially invited to do so, and are requested to inform the Secretary, who will send for their contributions, or, if preferred, a check to his address will be promptly acknowledged.

Annual members pay Five Dollars yearly to either the Park or City Branch. Those who desire to contribute to both funds pay Ten Dollars per annum. The funds are kept entirely separate, Park funds being expended for works of Art for Fairmount Park, and City funds for works of Art for the City.

All Contributions for Life and Perpetual Memberships and ten per centum of the Annual, are placed in the Permanent funds, which are to be kept inviolate until they each aggregate \$100,000, when the interest alone will be used.

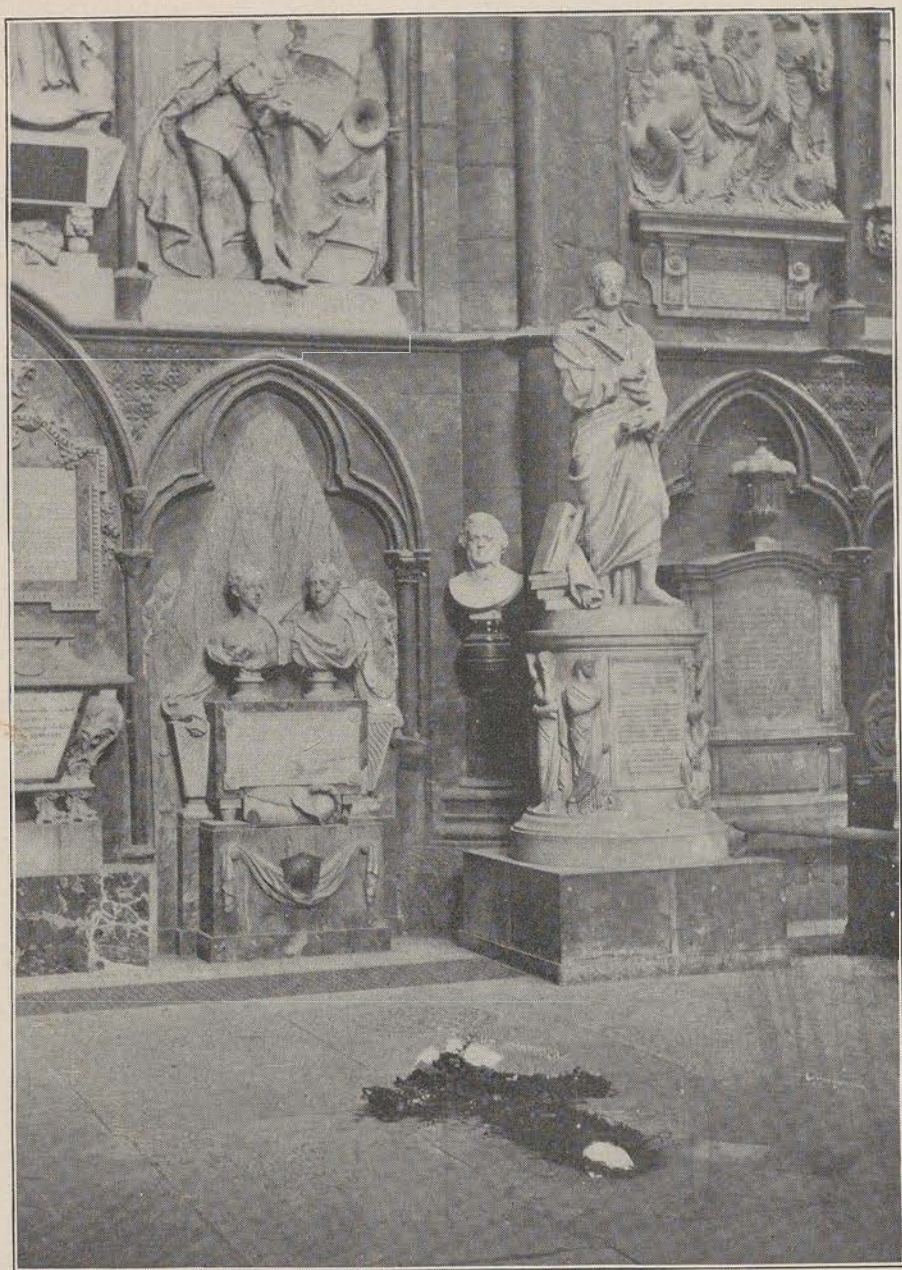

TRANSFERRED TO THE ASSOCIATION BY THE TRUSTEES OF FRANKLIN INSTITUTE. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, November 10th, 1877. Placed on the River Drive, under a rustic shelter, opposite the boathouses.

9. DRINKING FOUNTAIN. Granite

PRESENTED TO THE ASSOCIATION BY MRS. R. D. WOOD. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877. Placed on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

- 10-14. FIVE FOUNTAINS,* Bronzed Iron

Cast at Paris, France, at the Foundry of Val D'Osne. Purchased by the Association, and erected with basins, hydraulic fitments, etc., at the expense of the Association, in the Park near the Lincoln Monument. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 8th, 1877.

15. HORSE TROUGH, Italian Marble

PRESENTED BY CLARENCE S. KATES. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, December 15th, 1878, and placed on the Wissahickon Drive, near the site of the Old Log Cabin.

16. GRAND FOUNTAIN, Bronzed Iron

Purchased by the Association and erected with basin, hydraulic fitments, etc., at the expense of the Association, in the East Park, near the Dauphin Street Entrance. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, June 19th, 1879.

17. FOUNTAIN OF "ORESTES AND PYLADES," Bronze Group
BY CARL STEINHAEUSER, OF CARLSRUHE, GERMANY.

Cast by Bureau Brothers, Philadelphia. Mounted on a pedestal of Richmond granite, with streams of water pouring from four bronze masks. Placed near Columbia Avenue Entrance to the East Park, south of the great Receiving Reservoir, in September, 1884.

18. "SILENUS AND THE INFANT BACCHUS." - Bronze

Supposed to be a work of Praxiteles, the most famous of the ancient Greek sculptors. Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original in the Louvre. Purchased by the Association. Erected on a pedestal of granite, on the east side of the Main Drive, half-way between Fairmount Avenue Entrance and Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

*Two have been placed near East River Drive below Girard Avenue Bridge.

19. "THE WRESTLERS," - - - Bronze Group

Reproduced in bronze by Barbedienne, Paris, France, from the original antique in the Royal Gallery of Florence, Italy. **PRESENTED TO THE ASSOCIATION BY MR. A. J. DREXEL.** Mounted on a pedestal of granite, on the west side of the Main Drive, at the foot of Lemon Hill, near Brown Street Entrance to the Old Park, in November, 1885.

20. FACE AND HANDS OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN. - Bronze

These casts were taken from the first replicas of the original casts taken from life by Leonard W. Volk, Chicago, April, 1860. Deposited with the Pennsylvania Museum, Memorial Hall, Fairmount Park.

21-22. "FLORENTINE LIONS," - - - Bronze

Cast by Harrison, Winans & Eastwick at the Imperial Head Mechanical Works, at Alexandroffsky, Russia, in 1849, from the pair at the entrance to the Imperial Works, which, no doubt, were reproduced from those at the entrance to the Loggia di Lanzi, Florence. Of the two lions, one is ancient, from the Villa Medici at Rome, the other an imitation by Flaminio Vacca. **PRESENTED TO THE ASSOCIATION BY MRS. A. M. EASTWICK,** widow of a late member of the above firm. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, April, 1887, and placed near the Welsh Memorial, West Park.

23. HEROIC EQUESTRIAN STATUE OF MAJOR GEN.
GEORGE GORDON MEADE, Bronze
BY ALEXANDER MILNE CALDER.
A commission from the Association.

The United States Government donated a number of captured cannon, and the Legislature of the State of Pennsylvania appropriated the sum of \$5000 toward the expense of the granite pedestal; special subscriptions, largely aided by the Women's Auxiliary Committee, completed the fund necessary for its erection.

Cast by The Henry-Bonnard Company. Mounted on a pedestal of Pennsylvania granite. Placed north of Memorial Hall. Accepted by the Commissioners of Fairmount Park, October 18th, 1887, and unveiled with ceremonies participated in by representatives of the military and naval forces of the United States, the Grand Army of the Republic, the National Guard, and by distinguished citizens.

24. "STONE AGE IN AMERICA" - Indian Group, Bronze
BY JOHN J. BOYLE.
A commission from the Association.

Mr. Boyle's spirited group represents an Indian mother defending her children from an attack of wild beasts. A bear's cub, which she has killed with her stone hatchet, lies at her feet, and with her baby clasped to her breast she awaits the attack of the savage mother. The group is among the most masterly works which have been added to the works in the Park, and Mr. Boyle is undoubtedly the first sculptor who has adequately presented the Indian's case in American art. It was cast by Barbedienne, of Paris, and placed in West Park, near the Children's Play Ground, in 1888.

TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION.

PHILADELPHIA, October 31st, 1898.

To the Members of the Fairmount Park Art Association.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:—Your Board of Trustees presents this, the Twenty-seventh Annual Report, as follows:—

As will be remembered, announcement was made in the Twenty-sixth Annual Report that the statue of General Grant, with its pedestal, had been completed, that the statue had been placed in permanent position, and that the unveiling would take place on Grant Day, April 27th, 1898. When the time approached for making the necessary arrangements for the unveiling in the spring of this year, the condition of the country after the Maine disaster was such as to engross the entire attention of the public, as well as to claim the entire use of the military, both in the regular army and in the National Guard, hence it was decided by the Committee that to unveil the statue at that time would be quite impracticable. The matter was carefully thought over, and postponement finally decided upon until the autumn. Arrangements were then made with the Municipal Committee on the Peace Jubilee that the unveiling should take place on Military Day, the 27th of October last, and the Committee on Grant Memorial had begun perfecting its arrangements, through various sub-committees, to that end. A few days previous to the appointed time it was found that the route of the military parade, as decided upon by the Jubilee Committee was of such great length as positively to prohibit its being a part of the unveiling ceremonies at the Grant Monument. Suggestion was made that the unveiling should take place in an informal manner, but your Committee felt that it would be unfitting the memory of the great soldier to assent to any such arrangement. It was therefore finally concluded to withdraw the unveiling from the program of the Peace Jubilee, and definite postponement was made until Grant Day, April 27th, 1899. As far as can be seen, nothing will prevent the successful completion of this suggested arrangement, and it is hoped and expected that all

members of the Association will lend the influence of their presence on this very important occasion.

It is with great satisfaction that your Board of Trustees has the pleasure of acknowledging, by an additional appropriation of \$4,000, a total of \$9,000 voted by the City Councils of Philadelphia. The latter sum, through the Fairmount Park Commissioners, was devoted to the acquiring of a pedestal for the statue, and largely through this valued assistance the Association has been enabled to erect the Grant Monument permanently upon the East River Drive in Fairmount Park.

A symposium, arranged by Miss Pendleton, Chairman of the Entertainment Committee, was held at the Drexel Institute on the evening of March 26th, 1898, when a brilliant gathering listened to most interesting addresses by Dr. Persifor Frazer, Mr. Joshua L. Baily, Mr. Leslie W. Miller and Miss Pendleton, all accompanied by attractive stereopticon views. The trend of the addresses was toward the improvement of parks and gardens, their desirability in large cities, and the general advantages that would accrue to Philadelphia should the improvement of the west bank of the Schuylkill River, from Chestnut street south, ever become an accomplished fact.

Three sets of the Reports of the Association, from its inception to the present time, have been collected. One set, substantially bound, has been presented to the Philadelphia Library, one to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, and one to the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. There, it is felt, the volumes will be safely kept, and will prove of practical value to their recipients.

Following a custom recently adopted, and with the consent of Captain Chastreau, the reports for the last two years have been distributed to every member of the Park Guard, to ensure reliable information concerning our work to citizens and visitors generally to the Park.

SMITH MEMORIAL.

The Committee on Smith Memorial, of which notice was taken in the last report, has been actively engaged during the current year in the task of selecting sculptors to whom the bronze statuary on the proposed memorial arch should be assigned. After several months' careful examination and deliberation, the Special Sub-Committee of Five, entrusted with the detailed work, made an exhaustive report, with the list of the names of their choosing, to the General Committee, by which it was unanimously approved. Subsequently the report was placed before the Board of Trustees, and was unanimously accepted by them. A complete report was then submitted to John B. Gest, Esq., Trustee, and James H. Windrim, Esq., Architect, who have approved the findings as submitted. The work is now progressing rapidly toward an early completion.

It should be borne in mind that the Fairmount Park Art Association and the Committees appointed have no authority or supervision as to the architectural design and construction of the memorial monument and gateway, which are specifically provided for under the will of Richard Smith.

The report in detail is as follows:

PHILADELPHIA, May 6th, 1898.

To the Committee upon the Smith Memorial to be Erected as an Entrance Way in Fairmount Park, under the Auspices of the Fairmount Park Art Association.

GENTLEMEN:—The Sub-Committee appointed in accordance with the resolution of your Committee on March 12th, 1898, to examine the work of sculptors proposing to undertake the statuary upon the Smith Memorial, beg leave to report that they have given to the subject entrusted to them the most earnest attention and care.

The wide field covered by the resolution of your Committee has made necessary the delay of several weeks in completing the examination of the photographs and models submitted, and the actual inspection of all the works of sculptors which

have demanded recognition, and which could possibly be reached.

At the outset, in the performance of the duty imposed upon them, the Committee found that, while the works of the sculptors nominated by the General Committee were deserving of serious study, it would be necessary, in order to insure entire catholicity in result, that the number of nominations should be increased, and this was accordingly done, believing it would be wholly satisfactory to the General Committee. As already stated before your Committee, the general response to the circular of the Fairmount Park Art Association was a satisfactory evidence of the interest excited by the published proposals, but a close examination of the list of sculptors showed that no acknowledgment had been made by several of those whose names would be of great importance in a full consideration of the subject. Since then, two proposals which had been withheld on account of misconception of the scope of the memorial or a misunderstanding of the terms suggested, have been received, and the Committee has included these in the list to be acted upon. The full justification for this lies in the confident belief that the General Committee is, and of course can be, governed by but one general condition, namely, the securing for the present memorial in the Park, for the City of Philadelphia, and for all time, the best which can possibly be obtained. To accomplish this will be worth any reasonable sacrifice.

It will be, therefore, a sincere gratification to the Fairmount Park Art Association, and to the General Committee, that they have now before them the whole body of American sculptors, with but three or four exceptions, and that the only question for consideration and decision is that of fitness and artistic equipment for the work in hand.

The Committee has had six extended meetings, including visits to Washington, New York and Brooklyn, and these meetings have as a rule been attended by every member of the Committee. It may be said with propriety that, in reaching

the final conclusions, personal prejudice and every outside condition have been set aside.

The recommendations submitted herewith are unanimous, every member concurring in this report.

It was announced in the last Annual Report that the beautiful bronze group of "Charles Dickens and Little Nell" had been acquired by the Association for the City Branch. A considerable sum still remains unpaid to the sculptor, Mr. Frank Edwin Elwell, and it is exceedingly desirable that the membership in the City Branch should be so increased as to permit of a full settlement being made, and of a pedestal being provided without further delay. An appeal is therefore made to citizens generally to become members of the Association in the City Branch, in order that the statue may be erected during the early part of the coming spring. Suggestions are also asked of those interested as to a suitable location for the work, when ready for placing.

Reference to the Treasurer's report will show the permanent fund to approximate the sum of \$70,000, and the Board expresses its usual desire and anxiety to bring the amount up to at least \$100,000, so that the interest on the principal may be made available for artistic purposes in the line of the work of the Association.

The press of this city, as well as that of other cities at home and abroad, has exhibited its usual interest and courtesy toward the Association, which acknowledges them at this time.

The membership does not increase with the rapidity that is desired, and the Board makes an earnest appeal at the present time, when civic pride is uppermost in the minds and thoughts of Philadelphians, for their active interest and support in this excellent work. An increase of several hundred members during the next fiscal year is the least that should be expected, and it is confidently hoped that not only members, but all those interested, will make a particular effort to accomplish this very desirable result.

It is your duty to select to-day, from the members of the Association, five Trustees to serve for three years, and until their successors shall be duly chosen, in place of those whose term of service has expired.

THE TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

FAIRMOUNT PARK ART ASSOCIATION

WAS HELD IN THE

Lecture Room of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts,

Tuesday Afternoon, November 29th, 1898, at 4 o'clock.

Edward H. Coates, Esq., presided, and Charles H. Howell acted as Secretary.

The minutes of the Twenty-sixth Annual Meeting and the Twenty-seventh Annual Report of the Board of Trustees were read and approved. The report of the Treasurer, Henry K. Fox, Esq., was presented and ordered to be placed on file. Upon motion of Mr. Charles Roberts, the reports were ordered to be accepted and to be referred to the incoming Board, and that three thousand copies of the same be printed, as usual.

The following members were elected to the Board of Trustees for the term ending October 31st, 1901: Messrs.

The presiding officer addressed the meeting, a report of which appears on a subsequent page.

A letter from Mr. William Rudolph O'Donovan, the well-known sculptor of New York City, was read, and is printed following the report.

EDWARD H. COATES, Esq., addressed the meeting as follows:—

“I remember, Ladies and Gentlemen, that ‘The Country Parson,’ Dr. Arthur Boyd, whose delightful essays every one was reading thirty years ago, but which I presume no one reads now, made the suggestion that all kinds of work were most successfully accomplished when they were either actually or in one’s mind divided up or laid off into squares or blocks, as ingeniously described. An association like ours has this in view when every year it meets, as to-day, to consider what has been done for its block of work, which is the year just completed. We come together on these anniversary occasions to turn back and see what has been accomplished successfully, and to note the errors that have been made, and, if possible, to correct them. It is as if, being on a long journey, either of pleasure or discovery, we stopped at regular intervals to look across the landscape, to see the country over which we have traveled, and to confer together as to the best and wisest plans for the future. In accordance with this, we meet together this afternoon, to read the report for the twenty-seventh year of this Association, and, conforming to usual custom, the Secretary will now read the report for the past year.”

After the Annual Report had been read, and following the election of Trustees, as elsewhere stated, the Chairman continued as follows:—

“I think we may all feel a sense of satisfaction in the report made by the Board of Directors, and that we shall all have the consciousness that this Association is continuing the work which it has undertaken, and that it is doing it in an effective manner.

“In regard to work of this kind, we must, of course, realize that we are no exception to other associations, or indeed to other people generally, and that in all that we accomplish—

and I do think that the Association is accomplishing much—we have made, we must inevitably make, some mistakes, and that we can only use those mistakes to help us to do better work in the future. Our hope and our endeavor must be that this work shall be constantly upon a higher and nobler plane, and that our mistakes may be fewer and fewer. Looking over the past twenty-seven years, and considering what the Association has accomplished, we are now better able to appreciate what from year to year has been done; and I feel that in the main we are justified in the belief that the work of the Association has been a real success. In a speech made a short time ago by M. Arsène Alexandre, and reported in the Paris 'Figaro,' he makes the statement that during the past twenty years there have been about fifty statues erected in the city of Paris, and that not more than six out of the number are successful or acceptable. That is a very noticeable judgment, coming from a city which has given us such names as Fremiet, Falguière and Mercier; Rodin, Rude, Preault, Carpeaux and d'Epinay; and, while we do not wish to feel satisfaction in the misfortune of other people, still it is perhaps encouraging to know there are others, earnest as we are, who do not always reach the perfection at which we also aim.

"One of the important things we have to remember is that the mistakes of an association like ours—an Association which is putting up monuments in granite and bronze—one of our great difficulties is that our errors are not easily remedied. They are not like the mistakes which we make personally, which we can repent of and correct. Unfortunately, the work that is done by an association like ours is put up to stay; it is there for all time, unless we ourselves may have the courage and the vitality which the city of Boston has shown, after a great deal of opposition, to remove some monuments which were erected years ago, in a darker age than the present. It is possible that in this community the time may come when we shall feel it necessary to go back and undo a part of what has been done, but I do not feel that in the work of this Associa-

tion there is much of which the fate will be oblivion. Time, for an association like ours, is a matter of much importance, and in this country, where we all feel that things must be done at once, it is very well for us to reflect that perhaps we are wrong in this, and that we must not be afraid to take, for any art work that we are doing, or for any work which this Association has in view, whatever amount of time is desirable or required.

"It is a satisfaction to recollect that the great Cathedral at Cologne occupied four hundred years for its building. The poet Gray, we know, took eleven years to complete the 'Elegy.' Goethe worked for forty years upon his drama of 'Faust.' Shakespeare, you remember, wrote upon his manuscript of 'Hamlet'—'the eighth time, much improved.' Verocchio took twenty years for the 'Coleoni,' greatest of equestrian statues. We are told that Puvis de Chavannes, who has just died, took twenty-two years for the decorations at Amiens. Alexander Harrison, whose noble painting of the 'Sea' in the gallery above us has the appearance of being struck from a perfect mold, says that the sky in that picture was painted ten or twelve times. In art, time is of little importance in comparison with the result. What we want is the very best; to obtain this, and to take whatever time is necessary for it. We can do no better, in an association like ours, or in any long-continued work in which we are engaged, than to remember constantly the words of Emerson: 'That which befits us, embosomed as we are in beauty, is courage and hope, and the endeavor to realize our aspirations.' It is something for to-day and every day; for, after all, as Lessing says, 'Aspiration is everything.'"

My Dear Sir:—

An engagement for that day makes my acceptance of your kind invitation to say a few words at the twenty-seventh annual meeting of your Association impossible.

I trust, however, upon some other occasion to meet with you and give expression to my appreciation of your labors for the advancement of Art.

All of us interested in the immediate work of the artist or in its promotion, carry a grave responsibility, and owe it to the community which looks to us, to gather such wisdom as is in council.

Some thirty years ago Lord Beaconsfield made one of his fictitious characters say of us that we should always remain a provincial people, and if we are to be judged to this time by our art, the assertion is justified.

We certainly are still, in art, a province of France.

The few really great French painters of our time are so much more than French that one does not think of their country, but the same may not be said of their sculptors who, with all their unconventional felicity are still, with few exceptions, French, and lacking in that gravity which is the essential element of sculpture.

We should not wish to have an American school of sculpture. It might be better to become capable of pronouncedly personal work, and this may not unreasonably be expected of a people who are sovereign, who are not governed, but govern.

From Independence Hall in your good city of Philadelphia came first to the world the most pregnant of political axioms, and why not now from this same city issue to the first people really born free and equal a new Declaration of

Independence, not from political bondage, but from a provincial affectation of all foreign art?

Let us find in our sculpture as vital crystallization of patriotism, of beauty, and of religion, as these aspirations are with us, as was the sculpture of the early Italians, which moves us so profoundly to this day.

But just now we have passed from the state of adolescence into that of manhood. Let us throw over all manner of callow affectations.

"LITTLE NELL."

From the Bronze Group by F. Edwin Elwell.

Of all the work that has come from the hand of this artist there is nothing that has received such universal expression of love as the statue of "Dickens and Little Nell." Mr. Elwell feels that he has never done anything that he could look back to with more pleasure than this group. While he has always tried to forget the work that has passed out of his studio, so that it may not effect new subjects, Mr. Elwell often refers to Little Nell as his only daughter. Many times has this dear little figure come to him in those trying moments of an artist's life, with such tender love and patience that he has forgotten that there were those in his profession who were not working for its best interests.

Little Nell never forsook him, she always was what she has been, a figure in sculpture that did not breathe of the artist's personality; it stood quite alone, with its own individuality. This, then, was what Mr. Elwell started out to do in his art life, and from what has been seen of his work, there is a freshness and individuality about it that does not favor any school, except, perhaps, the noble Egyptian.

When the Little Nell was in clay there came a period when it was impossible to go on; the right kind of a face had not been found from which to draw inspiration to finish the work; day after day went by, and there seemed to be little advance made. One evening Mr. Elwell was invited to a concert where the music was delightful and the many friends brightened the life of the man. As the second part was beginning, Mr. Elwell turned, and before him saw the Little Nell of his dreams; gazing long at the charming little girl, an explanation becoming necessary, he rose, and stated to the father that he was making a statue of "Dickens and Little Nell," and that his daughter was the very ideal he had in mind. A few moments later he was at his studio, and worked on into

the night, until he had reproduced the spirit of the face he saw at the concert. The features are not of marked beauty, but are those of the type of a true woman; of that higher character of young womanhood that is not common, and, when seen, is never forgotten.

A most pathetic incident happened at the time the statue was being finished. The father of the little girl who had inspired the face of Little Nell expressed a desire to call at the studio and see the work. He was to come on a Monday morning, but passed away into the other life the preceding Saturday night. He never saw the statue, but will always be remembered by Mr. Elwell as the father of one of Nature's loveliest creations.

When "Little Nell" was exhibited at the Art Club of Philadelphia, it was given a gold medal, the second that had been awarded by the Club.

The rare simplicity of the Dickens group accounts for this love that Mr. Elwell has for the older masters rather than for the Greeks. Herodotus speaks of the immense influence the Egyptian masters had on Greek sculpture.

This exceedingly interesting bronze group of "Dickens and Little Nell" has been purchased by the City Branch of the Fairmount Park Art Association, and is ready for the pedestal.

The entire group won a prize at the Columbian Exhibition.

Many who have been entertained by Dickens' writings desire to contribute especially toward this unique group; others have been enrolled in the City Branch, to aid the purchase.

The income of the City Branch is not sufficient to complete the payment (\$7,500) at once.

One hundred contributions each of five, ten, fifteen, twenty and twenty-five dollars are invited.

If you consent to be one of the subscribers to this fund, an early reply will be doubly welcome.
